BACKGROUND ON NEXT WEEK'S READINGS THE BAPTISM OF THE LORD **JANUARY 8TH/9TH**

First Reading: Isaiah 40: 1-5, 9-11

This passage from the book of Isaiah begins with God calling the prophet to encourage the Jewish people exiled in Babylon. He is to tell them that they will be returning home soon, and the road of the return will pass through the desert. We will also hear God call the *people* to proclaim from a mountaintop the goodness of God.

Second Reading: Titus 2: 11-14; 3: 4-7

The letter to Titus was written about 30 years after Paul's death, and was written in Paul's name, a practice common in the ancient world. Titus was a traveling companion of Paul, and later was in charge of a Christian community on the island of Crete. The verses we are about to hear are also read as Masses on Christmas.



2022 Roe v. Wade Memorial Mass & Prayer Vigil Saturday, January 15, Cathedral Basilica of St. Louis (in-person and live-streamed)

Join the Respect Life Apostolate for the Archdiocese of St. Louis Roe v. Wade Memorial Mass celebrated by Archbishop Mitchell T. Rozanski on Saturday, January 15 at 10 a.m. at the Cathedral Basilica. Mass will include the Pro-Life Generation Memorial and the Life-Line Coalition collection, which benefits thousands of local pregnant/parenting moms, children and families annually. The Rosary Procession to and from our state's last abortion facility follows Mass, which marks the 49th anniversary of the Roe v. Wade Supreme Court decision which legalized abortion on Jan. 22, 1973. The prayer vigil concludes with a reception and fellowship in Boland Hall.
