## BACKGROUND ON NEXT WEEK'S READINGS THIRD SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME JANUARY 22ND/23RD

## First Reading: Nehemiah 8: 2-6, 8-10

The book of Nehemiah recounts events which happened about 100 years after the Jewish people had returned from the Babylonial exile. After their initial religious fervor, the people's moral life and commitment to God's law had lapsed. So, Ezra the priest challenged the people to renew their commitment to the law, and conducted what would be called today a "religious revival".

### Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 12: 12-30

Next week we continue our reading from the first letter of Paul to the Corinthians in Corinth, an important seaport. He was answering a letter they had written to him, containing questions about Christian life in their community. Among the questions was how to deal with the diversity of gifts within the community, and the rivalries and jealousies that inevitably arise. He responds by using an image that the Catholic Church has particularly emphasized.






