

Estamos celebrando el Domingo de la Palabra de Dios. Esta celebración nos recuerda la centralidad de la Palabra de Dios en nuestra fe. Estamos ya en el tercer domingo del tiempo ordinario. El Evangelio de este domingo establece el contenido del ministerio de Jesús. Comenzó su ministerio yendo a la sinagoga de Nazaret. Allí lee un pasaje de Isaías que luego dice que la se cumple en él. En otras palabras, el Reino de Dios se hace presente a través de la vida y las acciones de Jesús. El Reino de Dios es la predicación de Jesús. Reflection—What Holds Us Back

In one of my favorite movies, Sister Act 2, Sr. Mary Clarenceplayed by the larger -than-life Whoopi Goldberg-returns to teach music at a run-down Catholic school. In a pivotal scene, she confronts the film's star songstress, a teenager named Rita. Despite Rita's love for music and astonishing singing ability, she has recently dropped out of music class. Because of Rita's defiant attitude, Sr. Mary Clarence assumes that her sudden departure is simply a result of the teen's immaturity.

"I know you want to sing," Sister insists, having cornered her student on a busy sidewalk. "If you wake up in the morning, and you can't think of anything but singing first, then you're supposed to be a singer, girl." Rita turns away, rolling her eyes.

The well-meaning teacher doesn't know the many reasons why Rita has withdrawn from class. Rita loves singing, but she doubts her talent. And thanks to a protective mother who condemns her musical pursuits, Rita has resigned to an unhappier but more practical life path.

This scene reminds us that knowing and sharing our gifts is often more complicated than we acknowledge—something to keep in mind when reflecting on St. Paul's celebration of the diverse talents that comprise the Body of Christ, our Church. While marveling at the wonderful gifts that God bestows among us, we must also contend with the obstacles that accompany our call-

Sometimes we face structural difficulties, Just as Rita's mother admonishes that "singing doesn't pay the bills," economic and social realities often obstruct our ability to serve, whether in religious or secular settings. Other times, our insecurities inhibit us from owning and sharing our talents. Such is the case with Rita

The bold Jesus of today's Gospel embodies no such inhibition. Assured in his abilities and his calling from God, he courageously proclaims his mission. What would it take for us to inhabit such self-confidence? What holds us back from believing that our gifts, are, in fact, essential parts of Christ's body? Give Us This Day, Jessica Coblentz

St. Vincent de Paul Aid for Afghan Refugees

During August of 2021, thousands of Afghan families, most of whom supported our military for many years,

were forced overnight to flee their homeland with nothing but the clothes on their backs. As their country entered a new dark age, they fled to a new life in a land full of hope. In a few days over 100,000 Afghan refugees were flown into eight military bases in the United States, and have been housed there ever since.

In Racine County, the St. Vincent de Paul Society is preparing to assist Afghan families, in co-operation with another faith-filled community, North Pointe Methodist Church. Together we will help Afghan families acclimate to life in Racine by obtaining employment, accessing transportation, food, clothing, ESL classes, tutoring, etc.

We are asking that you consider giving additionally to Saint Vincent de Paul so that we can help these families, as well as continue our daily outreach within the community.

- St. Richard will be designating the SVDP collection on January 29th as an "extra giving" Sunday for SVDP Afghan Refugee Relief.
- St. Patrick's second collection on February 5th and 6th will also be for SVDP Afghan Relief.

Thoughts from Father Juan . . .

Grace and Peace to you my brothers and sisters:

We are celebrating the Word of God Sunday. This celebration reminds us of the centrality of the Word of God in our faith. We are now in the third Sunday of Ordinary Time. The Gospel for this Sunday sets the content of Jesus' ministry. He begins his ministry by going to the synagogue in Nazareth. There he reads a passage from Isaiah, after which he says that the Scripture is fulfilled in him. In other words, God's Kingdom is made present through Jesus' life and actions. The Kingdom of God is the content of Jesus' preaching. For Jesus, the Kingdom of God was to be present in his actions and teachings. Jesus' mission is to make present the kingdom of God in his actions and words. He spent all his life living according to the values of the Kingdom of Heaven.

Throughout the coming Sundays in Ordinary Time the Word of God will show us those values from the Kingdom: inclusiveness, mercifulness, forgiveness, compassion and humility, among others. Jesus makes clear in the Gospels that the Kingdom of Heaven is a place in which we all are welcome. I think the invitation for all of us is to live those values of the Kingdom here on earth. Sometimes, we think that to live in the Kingdom of God is for the future, or an afterlife thing. But actually, Jesus' teaching on the Kingdom of God has two dimensions: the here and now and the future realization. This is the Catholic principle of already and not yet. Jesus believed the Kingdom was already present in his ministry, but its fullness will come at a later time. The best way to make sure we get to share the Kingdom of God in the future is by starting to live it out now, as Jesus did. All his actions and words were directed towards making God's kingdom present.

My questions to you to ponder, my friends, are: Can we really say that we lead our lives according to the Kingdom values? Is there some urgency in my life about repenting and preparing to live the Kingdom? Can we say that the teachings of the Sacred Scripture are fulfilled in our daily actions and words?

This Sunday, in observance of the Word of God Sunday, I will make a presentation at Saint Richard's on the Gospel of Luke. The idea is to give an overview of Luke's Gospel since it is the one we are going to be using this year during cycle C. I intend to explore major themes in the Gospel and look at the uniqueness of Luke's account of Jesus' teachings.
