Pensamientos del Padre Juan . .

Gracia y Paz a todos vosotros:

El fin de semana pasado celebramos el Domingo de la Palabra de Dios. En mi homilía propuse un reto para este año en el que estamos leyendo el evangelio de Lucas. El evangelio de Lucas y los Hechos de los Apóstoles fueron escritos por el mismo autor. Mi desafío era leer un capítulo del Evangelio y luego Hechos cada semana. Eso sería un desafío para 52 semanas en total. El evangelio de Lucas tiene 24 capítulos y el de Hechos tiene 28. Espero que acepten el desafío.

El martes 25 de enero celebramos la conversión de san Pablo. San Pablo es un gran ejemplo de persona audaz y tenaz que vivió su fe en plenitud. El mensaje de San Pablo que define como el "evangelio" es fascinante. Pablo se centró en explicar que las promesas de Dios al pueblo de Israel se cumplieron en la vida, muerte y resurrección de Jesucristo. Para Pablo, el creyente necesita adherirse a Cristo a través del bautismo. La adhesión a Cristo tiene grandes consecuencias para el creyente especialmente en su identidad, sus acciones y creencias. El creyente recibe en Cristo una nueva identidad que transforma todas las relaciones. El creyente también se une a los demás miembros del cuerpo de Cristo -comunidad- a través de la experiencia del Espíritu Santo. Los invito a reflexionar sobre nuestra propia identidad como cristianos, nuestras propias acciones y valores que establecemos para la familia. Espero que la audacia de San Pablo nos inspire a ser audaces en nuestras propias vidas.

En el evangelio de hoy escuchamos que las personas se sienten incómodas con el mensaje de Jesús de llegar a los oprimidos y excluidos. La gente en la sinagoga se frustró con Jesús porque no hizo lo que esperaban. Sus expectativas del hijo de José, el carpintero, era continuar manteniendo el estatus quo dentro de la fe. No querían ser desafiados a reconsiderar su compromiso con la palabra y los mandamientos de Dios. Muchos de nosotros, en nuestra fe o en nuestra propia comprensión de la fe, no queremos ser desafiados más allá de eso. Estamos contentos con nuestro propio estatus quo. Espero que el ejemplo de San Pablo y las Palabras de Jesús nos inspiren a todos a ser desafiados y trabajar

Teach Us to Pray—Praying for Patience

Many of Jesus' parables are about slow growth. The tiny mustard seed that gradually turns into a large shrub. The farmer who plants his seeds and trusts they will sprout. The small amount of leaven that slowly raises the dough. In these parables, Jesus stresses not only God's ability to make something large out of something small but also the importance of waiting. And the importance of patience.

This is not a virtue that many of us have! Even when I'm waiting for a subway train a few minutes down the track, I find myself checking my watch. Why the hurry? It will come. A few more minutes on the platform won't hurt me.

Some of our rebellion against waiting may be a reluctance to admit we are not in control. We can't make the seed grow any faster than it is meant—nor can we make it sprout. But instead of seeing it as something we cannot do, why not see it as something God can do? God can create things that are better, fuller, and greater than we could ever imagine. But it takes time. And dwelling in that time takes patience.

What happens when you find yourself unable to dwell in that time? This is yet another occasion where prayer can be so helpful. "Give me patience, Lord," is one of my favorite prayers. Or as a friend once joked to me, "Give me patience, Lord...right away!" Give Us This Day, Fr. James Martin

Blessed Among Us—St. John Bosco

John Bosco was born to a peasant family in Piedmont. Following his father's death he was raised by his mother, an especially devout woman. The seeds of John's vocation were evident in early life. At the age of nine he had a dream in which he managed to tame a crowd of unruly boys after receiving encouragement from a mysterious lady. "Softly, softly," she told him. "If you wish to win them! Take your shepherd's staff and lead them to pasture." Gradually, even as an adolescent, he discerned his calling: to care for poor boys, to help them with their religious instruction, and inspire them to lead healthy, moral lives.

After pursuing ordination, John set about to implement his mission. He established an oratory to house hundreds of homeless boys. He organized workshops to impart practical skills and employment. His dedication drew wide admiration and support and, in time, a band of dedicated assistants. With them he formed a new religious congregation named after St. Francis de Sales.

The Salesians grew in number, and eventually their communities spread throughout Italy and across the world. John Bosco died on January 31, 1888. He was canonized in 1934.

"I have promised God that until my last breath. I shall have lived for my poor young people. I study for you, I work for you, I am also ready to give my life for you. Take note that whatever I am, I have been so entirely for you." St. John Bosco

During August of 2021, thousands of Afghan families, most of whom supported our military for many years.

were forced overnight to flee their homeland with nothing but the clothes on their backs. As their country entered a new dark age, they fled to a new life in a land full of hope. In a few days over 100,000 Afghan refugees were flown into eight military bases in the United States, and have been housed there ever since.

In Racine County, the **St. Vincent de Paul Society is preparing to assist Afghan families,** in co-operation with another faith-filled community, North Pointe Methodist Church. Together we will help Afghan families acclimate to life in Racine by obtaining employment, accessing transportation, food, clothing, ESL classes, tutoring, etc.

We are asking that you consider giving additionally to Saint Vincent de Paul so that we can help these families, as well as continue our daily outreach within the community.

Thoughts from Father Juan . . .

Grace and Peace to all of you:

Last weekend we celebrated the **Word of God Sunday**. I proposed in my homily a challenge for this year, in which we are reading the Gospel of Luke. The Gospel of Luke and the Acts of the Apostles were written by the same author. My challenge was to read a chapter of the Gospel and Acts every week. That would a challenge for 52 weeks all total. The gospel of Luke has 24 chapters and Acts has 28. Hopefully, you take me up on the challenge; that will be great.

On Tuesday, January 25 we celebrated the conversion of Saint Paul. I love Saint Paul as a great example of a bold and tenacious person who lived his faith to the fullest. Saint Paul's message, which he defines as the "gospel" is fascinating. Paul knew that the promises of God were fulfilled in the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus Christ. For Paul, the believer needed to adhere himself/herself to Christ through baptism. The adherence to Christ had consequences for the believer in his identity, his actions and his beliefs. Then, the believer receives in Christ a new identity, one which transforms all relationships. The believer also is united to other members of the Body of Christ -community- through the experience of the Holy Spirit. I invite you to reflect on your own identity as a Christian, your own actions, and the values that you set for your family. I hope the boldness of Saint Paul inspires us to be bold in our own lives.

In today's Gospel we hear that people got uncomfortable with Jesus' message to reach out to those oppressed and excluded. People at the synagogue got frustrated with Jesus because he didn't do what they expected. Their expectation for the son of Joseph the carpenter was to continue keeping the status quo within the faith. They didn't want to be challenged to reconsider their commitment to God's word and commandments. Many of us, in our faith or in our own understanding of faith, do not want to be challenged beyond that. We are happy with our own status quo. I hope the example of Saint Paul and the words of Jesus inspire all of us to be challenged and work harder in our spiritual growth to uncover the beauty of God's kingdom around us.
