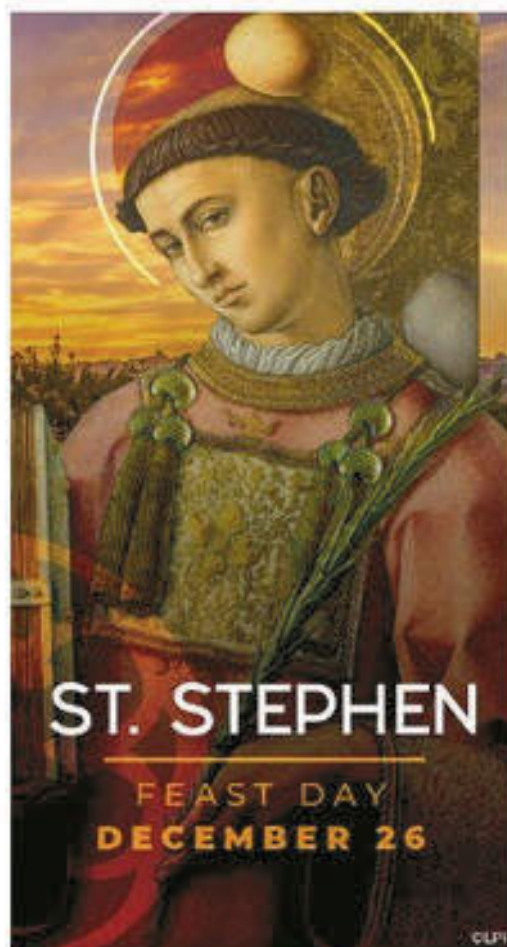

SAINT OF THE WEEK

The Acts of the Apostles tells the story of St. Stephen, the first Christian martyr. A man filled with grace and power, he worked great wonders among the people. Some Jews debated with St. Stephen but could not match his wisdom and spirit. Eventually, a charge of blasphemy was brought up against him, and the local population demanded that he be tried and sentenced. He was seized and carried before the Sanhedrin.

Despite the danger he faced, in front of the Sanhedrin and his accusers, St. Stephen gave a long speech about the history of Israel and the blessings that God had given upon His chosen people. He talked about how Israel had become disobedient despite God's abundant mercy. This enraged his accusers, and eventually the crowd dragged him out of the city and stoned him to death.

Even in his final moments, St. Stephen displayed great forgiveness and even asked God not to hold the sins of his attackers against them. Hundreds of years after his death, he is still a role model for us to follow.

Overlooked Feast...

Sandwiched between the feasts of Christmas and Mary, the Mother of God is this almost forgotten feast of the Holy Family. Sometimes called “the Hidden Years”, the truth is we don’t know much about the life that Jesus shared with Mary and Joseph. But the ‘school of Nazareth’ – the home life that the Holy Family enjoyed would leave an imprint on the messiah.

We get small hints of that life from the gospel. The bringing of the child to the temple for his purification, and again at the age of 12 as Matthew records, tells us that the Holy Family was steeped in the practices of the Jewish faith. Later on, the gospels record of Jesus: “Entering the synagogue, *as he was accustomed to doing...*” In this we come to know that Jesus observed the Sabbath faithfully. Sending the disciples to prepare the Passover feast also gives witness to Jesus’ “formation” in the home of Nazareth.

The “Yes” that Jesus is able to say in the Garden of Gethsemane in complete faith and trust, mirrors the “yes” that Mary said in response to the angel invitation to bear the Christ into the world. Joseph’s willingness to be led by his dreams finds an echo in Jesus, as he is ‘led by the spirit into the wilderness to be tempted’ after his baptism. And so it goes. What Jesus learned in the home at Nazareth, under the watchful care of Mary and Joseph, he lived throughout his adult life.

I believe that the same is true of our life here at St. Justin Martyr. The way we live together as a community influences so many people. It does matter that we come to church Sunday after Sunday. It does matter that we give witness to each other by baking our casseroles for St. Patrick’s, or bringing our Thanksgiving drive and Giving Tree items to help the poor in our Archdiocese, or by bringing communion to our shut ins. It does matter that we spend time together, at various functions, fostering the bonds of communion that exist between us. It does matter that we treat each other with respect, compassion and understanding.

These are the lessons that Jesus learned and lived from his ‘school at Nazareth’ – the home that he helped to create with Mary and Joseph. It is my hope that this, too, is the type of home that we continue to create here at St. Justin Martyr parish.

Perhaps, as you make your new year’s resolutions, you might weave one or two around your own ‘school of Nazareth’. What customs, habit of prayer, habits of charity and stewardship do you want your children to know and to live in their life? And once you name those, then the next steps become pretty clear...

Saint Justin Baseball/Softball registration will be open 12/2/21 and close 1/24/22 or thereabouts. In terms of start date, the latest information we have from the Archdiocese of St. Louis is the seasons will start April 2022 and end June 2022. We are working on options to shorten the length of the CYC season while still playing 10 games, but this is a work in progress. 3rd-8th Grade Softball/Baseball will play in CYC. The fee is \$95 + a uniform deposit.

Preschool, Kindergarten 1st and 2nd Grade Softball/Baseball will play through Queen of All Saints Instructional League. Fee is \$50. Any child currently enrolled in Preschool is eligible to play.
