



LIVE THE LITURGY

Inspiration for the week

Jesus stood in line with everyone else and was baptized. There is something incredibly humbling about how this must have played out. Then, God did something truly awesome and inspiring. Through a very gentle and simple action he let the world know about the special relationship He shares with Jesus. That's exactly what is so incredible about our baptisms as well! Through those holy waters God announces to the world the special place we also occupy in His heart. We no longer have to wonder about the purpose of our lives or struggle to find our way. We do not need to fumble around, tripping over ourselves and wondering why we are even here. The answer has been given. All we have to do is live out the vocation we have received, to live the Gospel in fidelity to our Creator. There is nothing to fear and worry has no place. Standing in line with other sinners, we have our anchor and God is very pleased.



SAINT OF THE WEEK

Born a pagan, St. Hilary (c. 315 – c. 367) studied philosophy and the meaning of life, eventually making his way through the bible. He became a convert and was appointed bishop of Poitiers in 353. Sometimes referred to as the Hammer of the Arians, St. Hilary defended the Nicene Creed against a popular heresy, Arianism. He was exiled to Phrygia for opposing Roman emperor Constantius II, who preferred the heresy which denies Christ's divinity. From Phyrgia St. Hilary fought with his pen, zealously writing against the heresy.

Eventually he was allowed to return to Poitiers, but did so by a circuitous route, preaching against Arianism all the way. St. Hilary was likely the first writer of hymns in the West, his writings on the Trinity, Psalms and Gospel of Matthew survive today. St. Hilary was created Doctor of the Church, a title given to those who provided important contributions to theology and doctrine, in 1851 by Pope Pius IX.

If the book of Ecclesiastes was being written now, instead of ~2,500 years ago, I would think they would add this line to the passage about there being a time and season for every activity under the heavens. "There is a time to be born and a time to die, a time to *mask* and a time to refrain from *masking*."

Though I had hoped to go to a mask optional mode in church once the Christmas surge had slowed down, somewhere around the 18th or 19th of January, the current infection numbers are the worst they have been at any time since the <u>beginning</u> of the pandemic. And though about the same percentage of people are becoming seriously ill and in need of hospitalization as with the original virus and the delta variant, because of the increase infection rate of the omicron variant, the sheer numbers of people who are infected once again threaten to overwhelm our hospitals. My doctor friend in Colombia continues to report her marching orders – other hospitals in Missouri are not receiving patients from anywhere.

In terms of mitigation strategies - the first line of defense from hospitalization due to covid and its variants is being vaccinated. With the omicron variant, now comprising 95% of the cases as of Tuesday afternoon, the data suggests that both the vaccinated and the unvaccinated are transmitting the virus in record numbers. Being vaccinated does not keep you from getting covid, but does keep it from being hospitalized because of your infection.

Masking, though imperfect, has been <u>helpful</u> in mitigating the spread. As is social distancing. As is our continual being conscious of hand sanitizing and not touching our nose and mouth and eyes. So, while this surge is at record numbers, we will continue to 'require' masks at church – seeing that a large number of attendees are in the 'at risk' category. (We <u>are</u> working on our school policy...)

I wish we were at a different place with all this. I would love not to have to meet with my principal and school board and pandemic team to wrangle over how to best keep everyone safe and in school. I read how omicron might be a blessing in disguise in that it is more contagious but not as virulent and might get us to a kind of herd immunity sooner, and phase this pandemic into an endemic. That day cannot come soon enough for us all.

But I am reminded that there is a time and a place for everything under the sun, including mitigation strategies... As they say – stay tuned!

As I write this we are just under a month away from our Celebration of Blessings event. This year, it is being held at the Holiday Inn at 44 and Lindbergh. Though I am not sure if there will be or what the county regulations might be by then, we are committed to doing this as safely as we can. The dining room is going to be just and only that – the place to dine and to chat. And you will be able to be a part of the live auction items via your smart phone without leaving your table. (So, if you are comfortable enough these days to go to dinner, the night will be like going to a restaurant.) Or, if you chose not to come in person, you can participate from your living room couch. More details to come, but we hope you choose to join us and celebrate the blessings that we are to one another...


