



#### LIVE THE LITURGY

### Inspiration for the week

Relationships are hard to clarify. Determining whether people in our lives are simply acquaintances and associates or a deeper level of friend is a journey that takes time. Identifying and celebrating those people who really care about us is a lifelong adventure that involves both moments of intense elation and heartache. Some relationships are more easily definable than others. Two people who are in love must decide whether the love they share has the freedom and depth necessary for lifelong commitments. Other relationships may look like friendship but may harbor grave dysfunction and toxicity. Discernment is needed on all fronts. Our relationship with God also needs definition and discernment. God has taken creation as His spouse and human beings as His children. God delights in us and all that He has made. The wedding feast at Cana demonstrates God's investment in all of this, especially our happiness. Life is a time for celebration and great rejoicing!



### SAINT OF THE WEEK

Not much is known about the life of St. Sebastian (256 – 287), except that he was a Roman martyr whose name has been mentioned throughout history since early 350.

We see St. Sebastian many times in art, especially from iconic paintings from Guido Reni, Andrea Mantegna and Hendrick ter Brugghen. Historical scholars now agree that a spiritual story has the beloved saint entering the Roman army because only there could he assist Christian martyrs without arousing suspicion on himself. Eventually he was found out, brought before Emperor Diocletian and delivered to Mauritanian archers to be shot to death. Pierced with arrows, he was left for dead, but managed to survive. He recovered from his wounds but still refused to leave.

One day, St. Sebastian took up a position near where the emperor was to pass. He confronted the emperor, condemning him for his cruelty to Christians. This time the sentence of death was carried out, and St. Sebastian was beaten to death with clubs. Today he is the patron saint of athletes.

### **Parish Library**

Did you know that our Library has two shelves devoted to Reference books. There are many books with information on the Bible, such as who lived there, Bible dictionaries, a Bible Concordance, commentaries, and an atlas. You'll also find books on Catholic blessings and prayers, religions of the world, Catholic catechisms and encyclopedias as well as church history, lives of popes and the saints. Two new Reference books recently added are *THE CATHOLIC SOURCE BOOK*, a super comprehensive collection of information to help people of faith, and *THE POPES*, biographies of the pontiffs' lives from St. Peter through St. John Paul II. I continue to be amazed at the generosity of so many parishioners in supporting the mission of this parish. Your faithfulness to this community and to our mission of making disciples is always inspirational. Mostly, I hope you know this: It

means a lot to this pastor's heart to know that you understand the gift of stewardship. And at its core is this – that we give generously, trusting that God is never outdone; that we give sacrificially, knowing that God multiplies our efforts and that we give from a place of gratitude, knowing how good our loving God has been to us.

Somehow, if we get those attitudes right, if we make those attitudes VALUES, then so much will continue to flourish in this parish of ours. Thank you for your stewardship, day in and day out.

That being said, as a little advance notice, when we send you your year-end statements, you will also receive your stewardship pledge card – asking that you recommit for this coming year the use of your time and talent and treasure. We would ask that you return those by mid-February at the latest so that we might be able to do our budget planning in preparation for our spring finance council meeting.


Also included with your year-end report will be the fiscal year report from 2021. (I know, like many things these days, this report is long overdue, as our fiscal year ended on June 30... Next year in Jerusalem, perhaps?)

So, as grateful as I am for so many people who have been so supportive of the parish, there is a trend that I (and the finance committee) notice. We are very good at fundraising. Which, in most parishes, would be a wonderful complement! The pastor in me, who values the spiritual component of stewardship over fundraising, is not so sure that is a good thing to be noted for. (For example, our Celebration of Blessing folks have already gone past their ambitious sponsorship goal for the event. And have lined up some amazing baskets – all in preparation for our biggest fundraiser of the year. I am so grateful for their work and energy. Theirs is a wonderful work of 'extraordinary stewardship'.)

But, on the down side, our 'ordinary stewardship' – via the Sunday collection and online giving, while a great blessing, does not cover our expenses on a yearly basis. Yet, at the same time, our cash position is as good as it has been since my arrival here. What has happened are these "extraordinary stewardship" funding sources. A \$300K bequest just before I arrived here. Then there was \$270K from the Beyond Sunday Capital Campaign – which was our portion of the total parish pledge to this Archdiocesan effort. Then there was the PPF funding during the first year of the pandemic nearly \$300K. And now, some EANS funding and a year-end gift from an individual combined for nearly \$165K. Wonderful events, no doubt. All of these are sources help to meet our operating expenses and strengthen our cash position.

One could argue that this is exactly how stewardship works. That God is never outdone in generosity. But I will say this, it does make our finance council a bit nervous. It is wonderful that these sources of funds have come. And they are signs of God's providence to us. As a pastor, though, this makes me want to double down on our stewardship message. Stewardship as a way of life is a pledge to trust in God with the first fruits of our lives. Maybe I am a dreamer, but somehow, it seems, if we are doing stewardship 'correctly', then our Celebration of Blessings becomes just that – a celebration of all the wonderful things God is doing among us, and less a needed bit of 'extraordinary stewardship.'

So, I invite you, as we do most every January, to fill out this year's stewardship form, coming to you with your year-end statement. Commit once more to a life of prayer, generosity and gratefulness – and then let God guide your decisions about how you might make a return to the Lord for all he has done for you...


