



LIVE THE LITURGY

Inspiration for the week

People can easily lose a sense of the sacred and transcendent. When we lose a sense of God's special presence, we need to be brought back. Ezra brought people back to the word of God and they realized what they were missing. Jesus proclaims God's word in the synagogue with true conviction and tells those gathered that he is the fulfillment of all that Isaiah taught. Even though people get lost, distracted, discouraged, and often journey down the wrong path, God's timeless law remains. When we allow ourselves to truly hear God's word and act on it, that living word slowly, over time, changes us. It has the power to soften and mold us, creating within us a joyful spirit. We realize the truth in what God speaks and become open to God's love. Gradually and gently God leads us back where we belong. We discover again the sacred character of life and the wonder of God's power. It is no wonder that Luke addresses his remarks to Theophilus. It is a name that means "beloved of God," a name that can be used by anyone who desires friendship with God.



SAINT OF THE WEEK

One of the most famous members of the Dominican Order, St. Thomas Aquinas (1225 -1274) is well-known by many for his theological work, "The Summa Theologiae." Born in Italy, his mother wanted him to become a Benedictine and had high hopes that he would eventually become abbot of Monte Cassino, where he spent much of his youth. To change his vocation, she had him kidnapped by his brothers on his way to Paris at the age of 19. He spent two years in their captivity. Despite this, nothing could shake him from his vocation to become a Dominican priest and he was eventually released. Once free, he went to Paris and then to Cologne, where he finished his studies with Albert the Great.

His greatest contribution to the Catholic Church is his writings. The unity, harmony, and continuity of faith and reason, of revealed and natural human knowledge, encompasses his writings. The Summa Theologiae, his last and, unfortunately, uncompleted work, deals with the whole of Catholic theology.

The patron saint of teachers, theologians and students, St. Thomas Aquinas died in 1274. His life and the impact he had on the whole Church, however, remains alive today. Please remember to let the Parish Office know of changes to the prayer list by calling 843-8482 x0. Thank you!

I have learned to listen for God's will and to pray that I proceed with His will. I have also gleaned that God can

love a sinner such as myself. I'm not perfect but with His help I'm better. I hope to continue to grow in my faith.



This coming Tuesday, Jan. 25th, is the feast of the Conversion of St. Paul and one of the 'big' feast days in the life of the church. One could argue that Paul, under the guidance of the Holy Spirit, was the single most influential person in the formation of catholic church as it has come to us. The breadth of his writings, his missionary journeys, the churches he established – he was a one-person dynamo, flinging as it were, the church to all the corners of the western (Roman) world. His was the impetus that pushed the catholic church into the gentile world. Forever, he stands with St. Peter, as foundational in the evangelization of the world.

So, it makes sense that his feast day would be chosen to begin significant events in the life of the church in the ages that followed. And so it is in our own Archdiocese, this year. THIS Tuesday, January 25th marks the public beginning of the "All Things New" initiative in the Archdiocese. You will be hearing a LOT about this movement going forward. But if you want to be in the know at the earliest stage, then go to <u>www.allthingsnew.archstl.org.</u> You will hear more about this and your part in the process in the weeks to come. But this landing page is the place to start...

(and as a heads up, if you are involved in coaching or the ACA or any of various and sundry Archdiocesan outreaches and ministries for which you have supplied an email address – you will be getting that many duplicate emails inviting you to visit the All Things New website. The people in charge know this. But, so important is this process that they are using every possible means to make sure everyone knows what is going on and has the opportunity to be heard... Keep one email, and delete the rest...)

So, at the Priests Council meeting today (Tuesday) we talked about "Tithing for the Poor" – a diocesan program where parishes who are doing well voluntarily give a portion of their income to help parishes and institutions that could use the help. St. Justin's is one of those parishes contributing to this effort. Traditionally those funds have been channeled to 3 places: The Rural Parish Workers of Christ the King, (serving the poorest county in the state of Missouri - \$6K in 2021); the Society of our Lady of Peace, (who do door to door ministry in North City, \$10K in 2021), and parishes struggling to keep their schools open. (\$50K in 2021) Having lived in a parish where we were more often than not 'holding on by our fingertips' financially, it is nice to be in a position where we can help other brother priests and fellow parishioners by our sacrificial giving. Though it is a small percentage of our total budget, \$1,000 a month goes to this funding source for the needs of our struggling brothers and sisters. This is part of the ordinary stewardship that I see so often exercised here at SJM. Thank you for your gifts...

So, Feb. 5th is **ON** for our Celebration of Blessings.

From there you can see the auction items, ready to be bid upon, as well as some raffle chances. The night will be similar to the last time we held the event – with casino games/blackjack/roulette and trophy's for the best gambler of the evening. Food and beverage are available in the dining hall, the live auction we be going on most of the evening, and then an oral auction. If you just want to be a part of the food and drink and auction – then upon registration you would park yourself in the dining room – where the food stations and the bars are close. And you can socially distance at your table.

It is not a risk free event if you go the in-person route, but we are doing our best to spread things out and create as much distancing from each area as we can. So, either virtually, or in person, I hope to 'see you all' on Feb. 5th...




