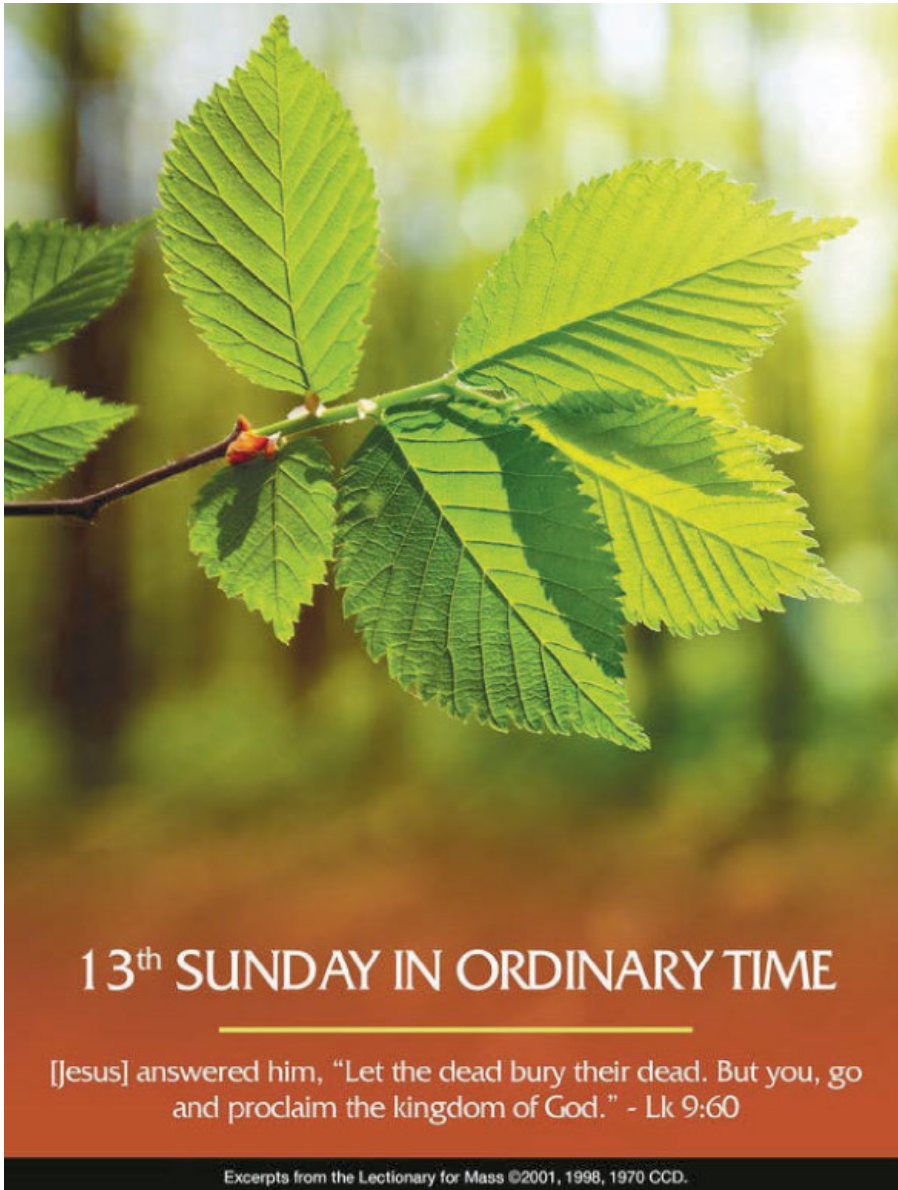

LIVE THE LITURGY

Inspiration for the week

God calls us in the midst of ordinary things. Often only looking for God in the dramatic, spectacular, the ritual or the sacred places, we miss that He is walking beside us. Every moment of every day, in every circumstance and experience, God is calling to us, "Follow me." Sometimes, we are too distracted to hear this call. Other times, we would rather ignore it or pretend it wasn't heard. God, however, is very persistent. Whether we fine tune our hearing to receive this invitation now or when we close our eyes in death, we need to make a choice. The choice involves leaving some things behind and moving forward, taking risks. Choosing to keep focused and single-minded, the lens we then use to see our world and one another is God's, not our own. Life is no longer about what is important or matters to me but what matters to God. We acquire a new filter and are asked to use that filter to make choices, establish priorities, and determine what direction we will take, and how to love. Once we accept God's invitation, we cannot keep looking back to what was left behind, only forward to the surprises yet to come.



SAINT OF THE WEEK

Saint Oliver Plunkett was the last Roman Catholic Martyr to die in England. He was canonized in 1975, the first new Irish saint in almost 700 years.

Oliver was born in Loughcrew, Oldcastle, County Meath in November 1625, the son of the Baron of Loughcrew. As a young man, he wanted to become a priest, but it was illegal to travel to the continent to enter seminary. Even so, he undertook the dangerous journey with four other young men and a Papal Envoy. They were pursued by English privateers, storms at sea, and robbers on land. However, Oliver entered Rome in 1647, and was admitted to the Irish College. He was an excellent student and was ordained on January 1, 1654. Oliver remained in Rome, studied law and served as chaplain at Sapienza University, ministered at Santo Spirito hospital, and cared for the poor and ill. By 1657 he was a professor of Theology and later of Apologetics or Controversies at Propaganda College.

The 1650s were a difficult time in for Catholics in Ireland, the majority of population, as Cromwell passed many penal laws against them, and the practice of Catholicism was banned. During this time Oliver was appointed by Irish bishops to be their agent in Rome. Following the Restoration of Monarchy, Pope Clement IX appointed Oliver Archbishop of Armagh and Primate of all Ireland 1669. Oliver returned to a country where the Catholic Church was in disarray and divided. He had to travel largely incognito and perform his duties in makeshift locations. He is credited with unifying the Church and in traveling across the eleven dioceses under his purview, confirming thousands, and ordaining several priests.

In 1673 persecution of Catholics was again on the rise and bishops were banned. Oliver went into hiding, but in 1679 he was arrested and charged with treason. He was hanged, drawn, and quartered at Tyburn in July 1681. Before his death he publicly forgave those responsible.

From the Desk of:

There are other things going on in the church besides All Things New.

The United States Catholic Conference of Bishops met this week for what is usually an every three-year week of retreat and prayer and fraternity. (Similar to our every four-year Convocation in the Archdiocese.) It has been six years since the bishops met for this purpose as their last gathering was pre-empted by unresolved issues with the Theodore McCarrick scandal. Talks were focused on unity and collegiality. Certainly, we keep our chief shepherds in our prayers, that their days together might bear fruit in the ministries.

The Synod on Synodality is a three-year process of listening and dialogue that began in Rome in 2021 and that will conclude in 2023. Pope Francis invites the entire Church to reflect on a theme that is decisive for its life and mission: "It is precisely this path of synodality which God expects of the Church of the third millennium."

This journey, which follows in the wake of the Church's "renewal" proposed by the Second Vatican Council, is both a gift and a task: by journeying together and reflecting together on the journey that has been made, the Church will be able to learn through Her experience which processes can help Her to live communion, to achieve participation, to open Herself to mission.

And here in the US, this past weekend began a three year process to deepen our awareness of the profound gift we have in Jesus and the Eucharist. The revival will include opportunities to nurture the belief and devotion to the Real Presence of Jesus Christ in the Eucharist. It is a beautiful invitation to grow in our living relationship with the Lord Jesus Christ in the Holy Eucharist; to experience His love and mercy; and to share that love and mercy with the

world.

The mission of the national revival effort is to renew the Church by enkindling a living relationship with the Lord Jesus Christ in the Eucharist. The four main pillars of the movement are healing, conversion, formation and unity.

The revival will culminate with a National Eucharistic Congress July 17-21, 2024, in Indianapolis

Though it will not happen until October, the majority of the Archdiocesan priests will be gone the week of October 3-7 for our above mentioned Convocation. Planning is well underway, and our theme is similar to the Bishop's retreat this week – Cultivating Unity. The purpose is three fold – to forge a collective sense of study and prayer, to promote more intense pastoral charity among priests and to make the presbyterate a more transparent sacramental sign.

Finally, Fr. Johnson has been gone this week on his annual retreat, which will end on Monday evening. He chose as the topic for this directed retreat: "Memento mori" - translated as 'Remember Death'. Though some of his prayer will be about his funeral plans and liturgy, and the practical things around leaving this planet, he also plans to reflect on his future in terms of where he will continue to serve the Lord – whether as a retired priest in residence here at St. Justin, or living at Regina Cleri, our retirement home for priest in the Archdiocese. He will be at the tail end of his eight-day retreat by the time you read this, prayers have a way of transcending time and will be there for him as he discerns what faithfulness looks like at this stage of his priesthood. His last words to me as he walked out the door were: "Oremus pro invicem" – Let us pray for each other. We do just that these days...

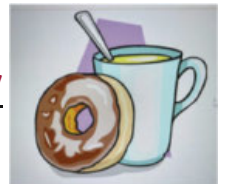
