Prepare For Next Sunday's Readings

In next Sunday's Gospel, (January 2) the Epiphany of the Lord, our Gospel reading tells us that we know little about the Magi. They come from the East and journey to Bethlehem, following an astrological sign, so we believe them to be astrologers. We assume that there were three Magi based upon the naming of their three gifts. We have come to consider the gifts they bring as a foreshadowing of Jesus' role in salvation. We believe the meaning of the gifts to be Christological. Gold is presented as representative of Jesus' kingship. Frankincense is a symbol of his divinity because priests burned the substance in the Temple. Myrrh, which was used to prepare the dead for burial, is offered in anticipation of Jesus' death. The word Epiphany means "manifestation" or "showing forth." Historically several moments in Christ's early life and ministry have been celebrated as "epiphanies," including his birth in Bethlehem, the visit of the Magi, his baptism by John, and his first miracle at Cana.

A Pilgrim's Progress....

A Blessed Christmas to you and yours! Our Advent journey has brought us once again to the Masses of Christmas and Sunday's Feast of the Holy Family.

At the mass of midnight we hear from St. Paul's Letter to Titus (always well received). Paul affirms the reality of Christ as God and Savior. "This is truly the Reason for the Season!" St. Paul also reminds his understudy Titus and all of us what effect God wants his presence among us to have: "to reject Godless ways" and to "live temperately, justly, and devoutly in this age," as "a people as His own, eager to do what is good."

Sam Guzman in his book, The Catholic Gentleman, offers some good (potential new year's resolutions?) ways to fulfill the Lord's desire for us. They are good rules for life or principles for every disciple (not just grown men) to strive to live by.

- 1. Fear, Honor, and Love God above all things even at the cost of my own life. This radical commitment would include rejecting "entertainment" that rejects our Christian morality. It means believing everything Christ teaches and striving to live His direction. Otherwise we build "our house on the sand" and have life's storms wash it away.
- 2. Honor holy things and treat them with respect. Fear of the Lord, understood as Awe and wonder in God's presence is one of the gifts of the Holy Spirit we receive at Confirmation. Maybe we have felt a sense of awe amidst the beauty of nature or the birth of a child. Would this describe our experience in Church? Do we trivialize God's presence there by a lack of respect. Do our external actions reflect our internal devotion in the presence of God?
- 3. I will begin to pray as if my eternal salvation depends upon it (it does). Prayer is simply raising our hearts and minds to God. It is a conversation with someone we know really loves us. Prayer is all about relationship. It is communication that leads to communion with God. If we have no interest in talking with God now, why would we want to spend eternity with Him in heaven?

- 4. I will strive for self-mastery and virtue (good habits) no matter how challenging. I will not accept mediocrity and my own excuses. I will embrace self-denial replacing what is not pleasing to God with what is.
- 5. I will chose the Beatitudes over the things the world values: finding God's blessing in poverty of spirit, mourning, meekness, thirst for righteousness, mercifulness, purity of heart, peacemaking, accepting persecution for righteousness sake. Meditating on the Beatitudes every day will change who we are. Guaranteed. We may know the starting line-up for our favorite sports team. Do we know all the Beatitudes? (Matt. 5:1-12)
- 6. I will treat all other people made in the image and likeness of God (that's everybody) with dignity and respect, especially the poor, the weak, and the neglected. Every saint who served those in need taught us that in doing so they were serving Christ Himself. Therein lies the unity of the two "great commandments," the love of God and the love of neighbor.

Every week of the new year our parish bulletin and each of our lives will give us opportunities to live these life principles. Chesterton once said, "the Christian ideal has not been tried and found wanting, it has been found difficult and left untried." May each of us do our best to prove Chesterton wrong this year. That would be a tremendous gift to Christ, our families, and our communities.
