

#### **Prepare For Next Sunday's Readings**

In next Sunday's Gospel, (January 16) we begin the liturgical season of Ordinary Time. To situate today's reading within the context of John's Gospel, we note that John's report of this event follows Jesus' call of his first disciples. John tells us that Jesus and his disciples were invited to this wedding at Cana, as was Jesus' mother, Mary. Marriage and wedding feasts are metaphors used in Scripture to describe God's salvation and the Kingdom of God. Here at the beginning of Jesus' public ministry, John's Gospel seeks to establish that Jesus is going to re-interpret and fulfill Yahweh's promise to Israel. Jesus establishes the New Covenant. A hint about what this New Covenant will be like is made evident in the deed that Jesus performs. Asked to do something to address the awkward situation that the absence of wine at a wedding feast would create, Jesus' *miracle produces vast quantities of wine—six jars* holding thirty gallons each are filled to overflowing with choice wine.

This lavish response to a simple human need is a vision for us of the abundance of God's kingdom. It challenges us to respond generously when confronted with human need today. We respond as best we can, fully confident that God can transform our efforts, bringing the Kingdom of God to fulfillment among us.

# A Pilgrim's Progress....

While the Christmas season officially ends with today's feast of the Baptism of the Lord, it is an admirable practice to continue to keep some tangible reminders of our Christmas celebration in our midst through the feast of the Presentation of the Lord, on the 40<sup>th</sup> day, February 2<sup>nd</sup>. It is even more admirable to live the pledge of Dicken's Ebenezer Scrooge: "I will honor Christmas in my heart, and try to keep it all the year!." Have you and I, like the magi, been so transformed by our encounter with the Christ Child this Christmas, that we are prepared to enter this new year by "another way?" How different will "Christmas yet to come" (and every other season) be because of our renewal?

Scrooge's conversion by the end of "A Christmas Carol" was simple even if difficult. Following a good examination of conscience, inspired by "spiritual visitors," he grew in self-understanding and decided to pay Bob Cratchit a just wage and to help Bob's family. For Scrooge, the renewal brought by Christmas was not a matter of mere sentiment, it brought practical consequences and changed behavior. As Niall Gooch, reminds in the Christmas issue of the Catholic Herald, bringing about peace on earth and good will to all "isn't a command to feel a certain way, it is an imperative to act in a certain way." After giving them the parable of the Good Samaritan, Jesus tells his disciple to "go and do likewise."

The key to avoiding any "post-Christmas blues" it would seem then, is not in being preoccupied with how we "feel," but rather focusing on how our actions are "manifesting" the virtues of Christmas and Epiphany: peacemaking, goodwill, and charity. It means becoming living signs of the gifts the magi presented to Christ by a purer faith, more consistent worship, and a more genuine sacrifice. We can focus on the invitations and opportunities each day brings by not comparing ourselves to others but by God's grace becoming "a bit better today than yesterday."

I can't think of a better way to live our Baptismal promises than by "keeping Christmas well all year round." Sail On, fr john
