The individual receives from the Holy Spirit the graces of "strengthening, peace, and courage to overcome the difficulties that go with the condition of serious illness or frailty of old age. " CCC 1520

Anointing of the Sick will take place at St. James immediately following all Masses during the weekend of March 9th and 10th. Parishioners will be invited to remain in their seats following Mass if they wish to be anointed.

2/25 2nd Sunday of Lent Let us make three tents (Mark 9:2-10)

Sometimes I get stuck in a rut, and sometimes I get stuck on a mountaintop. Peter "is stuck" when he suggests pitching tents; he wants to bask in the mountaintop experience for a while. But Jesus has different plans to continue his ministry - and rejects the tent idea. As a society, we've certainly been stuck - stuck depending on fossil fuels. In some ways it's been a mountaintop life. After all, we enjoy lights (mostly, powered by coal) and heat (powered by natural gas). But it's time to move on. We have the potential for 90 percent of the world's electricity to be generated from renewable energy by 2050. But for NOW -

Kate, our Lent Mentor suggests, there is much we can do to reduce energy use:

- Check out the Waukesha County Green Team website for more ideas.
- Use lids & boil less water when cooking
- Insulate the water heater
- Change the furnace filter every 3 months
- Clean the dryer lint trap
- Set back the heat 5-8 degrees at night or when the house is unoccupied over 4hrs
