

From the desk of Fr. Evans

Dear Brother/Sister in Christ,

May Christ guide and strengthen you this week! A 12-year old girl was walking home from school. Some young men aggressively surrounded her. She calmly made the sign of the cross. They said, "What is that silly gesture?!"

Her response: "I worship a God Who loved me so much, he died a gruesome death on a cross for me. Your opinion of me does not matter!" She kept walking. St. Severa, as we now know her, was eventually martyred, but not that particular day.

The first thing the cross does is ennoble us. Have you ever felt "down in the dumps" about yourself or your situation in life? I'll admit I have sometimes. The cross reminds me that I was/am worth dying for.

I have seen footage from London, of people receiving knighthood. The cross confers the highest order of nobility! Enjoy! Until next week, know that I remain



PS: I almost forgot, it's Time/Talent weekend!! When we talk stewardship, most people immediately think money/ treasure, then time, then talent. Let's flipflop it! Let's talk talent! I don't know about you, but when I hear "talent," I immediately think about musical abilities. We love you, Rita! But talent is so much more than music. A more Catholic word for talent is charism, a gift from the Holy Spirit, given to one person, for the benefit of the community. Sometimes it helps to start with some more obvious charisms, and go from there. Hospitality is a charism. I know many people both in our parish, and others, who are so good at making others feel welcomed. That's a gift/ charism! Have you ever told a person that you'd pray for them, and they got better? Healing and intercession are charisms. And of course, healing is not just physical. When I was in college (not yet seminary), a fellow student told me she was homesick. I said I'd pray for her. Two days later she came to me and said, "You prayed for me! I could feel it!"

Those of you that are married, Christian marriage is a charism, as is a charism that I have, celibacy. Both marriage and celibacy are spiritual superpowers given to individuals to benefit the community.

You just might have a hidden charism, one that corresponds to our parish Time/Talent Sheet. Please ask the Holy Spirit to reveal it to you. And I need to give you a disclaimer: sometimes we make mistakes in discerning our charism. While all charisms involve spiritual stretching, a charism/ ministry should be more life-giving than not. If it isn't, that's okay! We have a long list; I'm sure we can help you find another one.

Please know that, for all you do for the parish, in whatever way, I am so grateful and pray for you several times daily!
