Dear Brother/Sister in Christ,

May the Holy Spirit guide and strengthen you this week! This is a crazy weekend, isn't it! Yesterday, Jesus was born. Today, we have two feast days overlapping. The one that get's overshadowed this year is the first-ever martyrdom. St. Stephen was killed for preaching the Name of Jesus Christ. He died praying for the conversion of those who killed him. One of them was Saul of Tarsus, who, in answer to Stephen's prayer, became St. Paul. God is an infinite and eternal Three Person party! He wanted to show us how to form our own party. So, He created the family. And not only did He create the family; He entered a family of His own, the Holy Family. That is what we celebrate today. At the time of our Lord, he scratched the pride of a feeble, earthly "King," who, to protect his kingdom, had to kill every male child. Tuesday, we commemorate Herod's Massacre of the Innocents. But are we any more civilized today? As one born after 1973, I am a survivor. I have countless friends who did not survive the modern massacre of the innocents. Potential doctors, statesmen, priests, religious, humanitarians, and peace-keepers have all been killed by this evil. What if they had been allowed to live? Sad thought. But, as our Jewish brethren say, it is better to light one candle than to curse the darkness. Recite the "PPS" prayer below, to light that candle. And remember, Christmas is the season of a joy deeper than any sorrow. The waves rock back and forth, the ship moves, but the anchor remains fully grounded and stable.
