## FEAST OF CHRIST THE KING

With Fr. Will

On Sunday, November 22, Christ King Parish celebrates a grand feast—a solemnity. It is the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe. The word solemnity is often interpreted as “solemn” and understood as grave or somber and conveys seriousness, maybe even sadness. However, the liturgical life of the Church honors a solemnity as a joyful, glorious celebration bringing the mysteries of faith alive, ingraining them in our lives. We rejoice with the angels and saints in heaven as we glorify and praise God in his almighty grandeur. What better day to do this at Christ King as we celebrate the majesty of our Lord Jesus Christ's kingship over heaven and earth! For this reason, there is, indeed, great festivity and rejoicing, particularly in the Sacred Liturgy of the Sacrifice of the Mass.

Composed of body and soul, human beings crave to celebrate the sacred mysteries in beautiful and solemn celebrations that involve our senses and raise our hearts to God. Celebrating these solemn days before the Holy Eucharist is so important because we profit spiritually from the physical gifts of Jesus' Body and Blood.

This great feast also happens to be the last Sunday in Ordinary Time as we prepare to enter a new liturgical year with the beginning of Advent the following Sunday. Thus, the Feast of Christ the King is situated appropriately at the end of the year when we hear a strong eschatological theme

within the readings, particularly the Gospels, of the end times and the four last things: death, judgment, heaven and hell.

This great feast invites us into honest self-reflection, deep examination of our consciences and more intentional prayer in our daily life. These practices lead to more active discipleship and evangelization as Christians and as Catholics. Truly, as we experience the barren wasteland and delusion of secularism within our culture, this is a time to find our way by the light that radiates from Christ sitting gloriously on his throne. He is the Beginning and the End, the Alpha and the Omega. Our time belongs to him and we must live in him.

Secularism is really at the heart of why the Feast of Christ the King was instituted. Efforts on the part of many have been made to remove God from society. On December 11, 1925, Pope Pius XI, recognizing the rising tide of secularism in the world, responded with a papal encyclical called *Quas Primas* instituting the Feast that we celebrate.<sup>1</sup>

The ideology of secularism has been pushing both religious

freedom and practice out of the public sphere and limiting it to the private lives of individuals throughout the history of the world. It's fair to say that this has only intensified in the recent past. The end goal is to remove any likeness of God from our culture. Ultimately, the one, true God is always replaced with false gods.

Pope Pius XI responds to secularism saying, “When once men recognize, both in private and in public life, that Christ is King, society will at last receive the great blessings of real liberty, well-ordered discipline, peace and harmony.” If our time, if our very lives, belong to Jesus Christ, then we must be conformed to the will of the king in every aspect of our lives whether that be public or private. Jesus is Lord and king over our individual selves, our families, our nation, and we must recognize him as such. Christian living can never be limited or contained to our private spaces. Discipleship demands that we live our faith publicly despite the fear Satan cunningly uses to prevent us from doing so courageously and confidently.

We must have our ultimate loyalty not to the kingdom of



this world, but to the kingdom of Jesus Christ. On bended knee we allow the Lord to reign within us. But how?

Pope Pius XI explains, "He must reign in our minds, which should assent with perfect submission and firm belief to revealed truths and to the doctrines of Christ. He must reign in our wills, which should obey the laws and precepts of God. He must reign in our hearts, which should spurn natural desires and love God above all things, and cleave to

him alone. He must reign in our bodies and in our members, which should serve as instruments for the interior sanctification of our souls."

As Soldiers of Christ, perhaps we feel like we are losing the battle against the evil of secularism or that we are not allowing the Lord to reign within our own hearts. Fear not! We celebrate this feast filled with the spirit of Christ which compels us to cry out, "¡Viva Cristo Rey!" He fills our hearts with faith, wipes the tears of

anguish and with a loving concern seeks us out as a shepherd seeks the sheep of his flock going so far as to die for us and grant salvation.

On this Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe, we recommit ourselves to the Lord striving to bring about his kingship in this world. We begin by making our hearts a throne for him to reign from within.

The Lord is king! Let the earth rejoice!

## NEW AIR PURIFICATION PROJECT

The parish has committed over \$150,000 to install needlepoint bi-polar ionization in all spaces used for extended periods. Filtration will cover all school classrooms, the school office, North Hall, and the parish office.

The project includes approximately \$60,000 for devices installed inside the room unit ventilators (preferred option), and high-level portable units in the remaining spaces. Many unit ventilators are not functional and replacing them costs over \$700,000. At this time, the first phase of the replacements will occur. Unit ventilators will be replaced in five classrooms at a cost of approximately \$90,000. Some other unit ventilators can be temporarily activated with replaced motors and other parts.

The remaining non-functional unit ventilators will be replaced in phases over the next number of years. This is dependent on your ongoing stewardship pledges to create funds available for this project through the parish budget. When future unit ventilators are replaced, the preferred in-unit filtration devices will be installed. The portable units will then be repurposed to other areas of the parish.

Funds for this unplanned project come from three

sources. Most significantly, the ongoing "Living the Call, Sharing God's Gifts" Capital Appeal. The boiler was installed under budget, leaving funds available. Secondly, an anonymous special gift was given to start this project. Thirdly, another donation may help replenish the capital appeal allocation used for the project. Thank you to all appeal donors and the special donors who helped.

Additional thanks are due to a subcommittee of the COVID Task Force for initial conversations on this project and the parish Finance Council who thoughtfully created a path forward. The work is being completed by Automated Energy Solutions, Inc. owned by a parish school alum.





## Sacraments:

### Infant Baptism

Baptism is an initiation into a new life of discipleship and access to the full spiritual riches of the Church. The parish rejoices at the gift of new life and seeks to assist you in this mission as parents, starting with the sacramental grace of Baptism. Preparation sessions are held regularly among our tri-parish collaborative relationship. For the convenience of parents, we encourage you to begin preparation prior to the birth of the child. Baptisms are celebrated on particular Sundays of the month either during Mass or after Mass. Contact the parish office for details.

### Marriage

The grace proper to the Sacrament of Matrimony is intended to perfect the love of a couple and to strengthen their indissoluble unity. By this grace, they help one another to attain holiness in their married life and in welcoming and educating their children. Our parish rejoices at the gift of marriage.
