

## BEAUTIFUL SURPRISE: TRIDUUM AND EASTER CELEBRATIONS

With continued hesitation related to the coronavirus and pent-up desire to travel over spring break, I mentally prepared for much smaller celebrations of the Triduum this year (Holy Thursday, Good Friday, Holy Saturday). To my delight, I was completely wrong!

Holy Thursday was not only deeply prayerful, but full. Good Friday celebrations at both Saint Bernard and Christ King were standing room only. And, with tremendous joy and surprise, we witnessed an Easter Vigil on Saturday night that was the largest gathering I had ever seen at that celebration. The church was nearly full as we welcomed three individuals into the Catholic Church, conferred Confirmation on an adult Catholic and recognized that five more individuals had entered the Catholic Church at other points in the last calendar year. That's truly remarkable. And Easter Sunday celebrations were full at all Masses, including countless new faces in our churches. Alleluia!

Holy Week and Easter is the most intense time of preparation for our parish staff and liturgical ministers. May I recognize several individuals we are blessed to call our collaborators who make this all happen.

- Bill Lieven, Director of Liturgical Music for Christ King and Saint Bernard. Bill has masterfully navigated adapted musical ministries this last year yet still produces beautiful and full sacred music to help us pray. And if you have not yet heard the test use of the grand new Christ King Organ (it is only 50% constructed), you are in for a treat when you hear the magnificent sound it is already producing. Because of the kind of instrument we invested in, I am already struck at how strongly and beautifully it encourages congregational singing. Exciting months are ahead as the construction and voicing continues by the builders from Juget-Sinclair.
- Maggie Pernice, Director of Liturgy for Christ King who also provides generous assistance to Saint Bernard. Maggie gracefully and calmly assembles the hundreds of details necessary for high quality prayer. She also has done this with adaptations this last year, making her work far more complicated.
- Mary O'Connell of Saint Bernard handles all the

liturgical details for Saint Bernard, working together for our shared celebrations of the Triduum with Christ King. A person of deep prayer and joy, we are so lucky to have Mary's enduring generosity and attention to detail.

- Greg Smrz, our liturgical musician with a focus on Saint Bernard provided his usual beautiful musical gifts to help us pray so well.
- Thanks to a cameo by Gail Martin who made the organ at Saint Bernard truly come alive with her preludes and postludes on Sunday.
- And thanks to Fr. Will Arnold, our Associate Pastor, and Deacon Peter Rebholz. Both of whom I am honored to call brothers in ministry and who helped us pray so well at the celebrations.
- Thanks to all liturgical and music ministers, and to John Pernice and the Boy Scouts who assisted with a beautiful but safe Easter Fire in dry conditions.

## IS YOUR HEARING FAILING? CHURCH SOUND SYSTEM

Is your hearing failing? Maybe. But it might be that you're witnessing the physical components of our sound system in the process of failure.

The system has been extremely reliable, lasting many years past its expected life. But we have now discovered perhaps half of the physical components not working, with the rest starting to follow in the cycle of death nearly every week. The main center speaker may be operating at less than half capacity and not providing proper directional sound. The auxiliary speakers (in the Notre Dame Chapel/Quieting Space, entrances and exits, seating areas near the baptismal font and Saint Joseph statue) are barely working. It is necessary to now replace the whole system.

To temporarily compensate - poorly - we need to increase the volume on the operational parts of the system, resulting in increasingly distorted audio, low audio, feedback, and guesswork every time we turn it on.

The parish finance council and our staff thoughtfully reviewed three bids to replace the system. Due to our large space and complex acoustics, this will cost around \$140,000 (the lowest bid, we believed, mis-designed a system

for our needs and the highest bid was approaching \$200,000). Thanks to your generosity a few years ago at the parish auction, the system was updated from an analog to a digital system. That will have been a down payment on this upcoming project; we will build on the components updated a few years ago.

I offer my gratitude, in advance, for your financial stewardship that will make this most critical replacement possible. Thanks to your attention to parish financial stewardship in the past and years of good work by the parish staff and finance council, we have a rainy-day reserve fund that

can support this. However, I'd love to replenish that fund. Then we will be ready to carefully and strategically review options when future rainy days show up.

It will take some time to order components and install the new system. I thank you for your patience as we "make do" until this is completed.





## Sacraments:

### Infant Baptism

Baptism is an initiation into a new life of discipleship and access to the full spiritual riches of the Church. The parish rejoices at the gift of new life and seeks to assist you in this mission as parents, starting with the sacramental grace of Baptism. Preparation sessions are held regularly among our tri-parish collaborative relationship. For the convenience of parents, we encourage you to begin preparation prior to the birth of the child. Baptisms are celebrated on particular Sundays of the month either during Mass or after Mass. Contact the parish office for details.

### Marriage

The grace proper to the Sacrament of Matrimony is intended to perfect the love of a couple and to strengthen their indissoluble unity. By this grace, they help one another to attain holiness in their married life and in welcoming and educating their children. Our parish rejoices at the gift of marriage. Contact the parish priests or the parish office as soon as possible prior to planning a wedding, so as to allow the support and preparation process the Church provides to future married couples.

### Anointing of the Sick

Anointing of the Sick is a powerful sacrament of healing for one's body and soul. It can be requested any time, most conveniently after a Sunday Mass. Contact the celebrant to request this sacrament. The parish priests may be contacted directly to celebrate this sacrament by appointment as well.
