SACRAMENT OF RECONCILIATION

The Sacrament of Reconciliation is available after the 8:15 AM Mass on Saturdays. Confessions are heard in the North Cry Room with the option of using a confessional screen or sitting face-to-face socially distanced from the priest. Those waiting for confession should line up in the center aisle of the church while maintaining social distance.

Reception of the Sacrament may also be requested by calling the parish office to make an appointment. Arrangements will be made for either the pastor or one of the resident Nigerian priests to assist you.

SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM

Parents of children for Baptism should be registered parish members. Contact Gary Heun to register and to schedule a date. Parent instruction class is required before Baptism. Classes are held on the first Wednesday evening of odd-numbered months.

The Insights of a Widow

Many people who go through the death of their spouse acknowledge that the real grief kicks in after the funeral. They feel the loss most after the business of the funeral and the visiting out-of-towners are over and they eventually sit in their home alone with the things that they collected throughout their marriage. The things are a comfort that they are at home and safe. The things also trigger sadness of happy times in the past. The things will eventually need to be gone through as a second reality settles in that they probably won't be as valuable to others as they had seemed to them.

In our Gospel it is one of these widows who is powerless on many levels taking what little she has and giving it to the temple treasury. Jesus notes that she put to the use of God all of her livelihood.

Widows and widowers will not just give money to their church but give dishes to younger friends, jewelry to grandchildren, and artwork to the next visitor to admire it. They collected these things with the love of their life but in death it becomes crystal clear that it was about the love and not the things. The persons in deep grief are starving for connection to God and the love of family and friends.

As we continue our stewardship discernment, we consider how we can better care for people in grief. Our

MacCanon Brown Homeless Sanctuary Push for Occupancy

- Many churches and other donors have contributed to get this building so close to occupancy.
- The food and clothing are inside but the people in need have to wait outside.
- Nurses and other care people trying to assist, need to do their work outside under this tent.

What does it take to get occupancy:

\$33,900 to get the essential work done to open the indoor welcoming center.

Myself and the Pastoral Council leadership, who have been positively discussing this issue for the last year, believe St. Jude can take the lead in raising this money. We can also reach out to individuals and generous corporations outside of our parish.

The goal is clear, winter is coming, and if we make a push to raise this money in the next two weeks we might be able to give this important center, to care for the poorest of the poor around 24th Place and Center St. in Milwaukee, a warm space to care for the people by Christmas.
