MARRIAGES

By appointment with priest at least 6 months in advance. You must be a registered member of the parish. Weddings are not scheduled during Lent.

SACRAMENT OF RECONCILIATION

The Sacrament of Reconciliation is available after the 8:15 AM Mass on Saturdays. Confessions are heard in the North Cry Room with the option of using a confessional screen or sitting face-to-face socially distanced from the priest. Those waiting for confession should line up in the center aisle of the church while maintaining social distance.

Reception of the Sacrament may also be requested by calling the parish office to make an appointment. Arrangements will be made for either the pastor or one of the resident Nigerian priests to assist you.

SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM

Parents of children for Baptism should be registered parish members. Contact Gary Heun to register and to schedule a date. Parent instruction class is required before Baptism. Classes are held on the first Wednesday evening of odd-numbered months.

Time Is Short - We Need to Act Now

I was just reviewing with our school's 7th graders about the huge but finite universe expanding into an infinite space. Everything, therefore, has a beginning and an end. Our solar system should be good for another 10 billion years but eventually our sun and other stars will run out of gas.

Sometimes our own smaller worlds fall apart more quickly. Thirty-seven years after Jesus, Rome attacked Jerusalem by seizing it right before Passover and eventually destroying the city including the temple. Tens of thousands of believers died during this attack and the people were sent off in all directions.

Sometimes a key person in our life is suddenly severely injured or dies and our way of life changes. Sometimes the terminal situation is our own and catches us by surprise.

For all of these reasons we choose to live with purpose now. We commit to love, to build a family, a business or a cause. We know we cannot take this living body to heaven so we use all of our talent now to the point of exhaustion to build something that will last. When Jesus learns that he is about to die he lives with great purpose so he will be with us forever in the Eucharist, and in his church, and in his words. All of these will be eternal so we wish to use our short time as well joining him in this work.

For the past six weeks we have focused on some of the stewardship areas of our parish. Now is the time to respond that you wish to be a part of this. Please call the office or e-mail stewardship@stjudetheapostle.net to let us know how you can help with these various ministries.


Annual Parish Meeting

Father Mike said the opening prayer. The minutes of the September meeting were approved.

Pastor's report – Father Mike

Father introduced the new Director of Administrative Services, David Grunwaldt. David will start on a shared basis continuing at St. Agnes until their position is filled.

Our new Interim Director of Liturgy & Music, Michael Batcho, is a real gift and working well with the school children and the choir. Gary Heun is covering some of the music responsibilities.

The Thrift Shop has re-opened on Wednesdays and Saturdays with the new Thrift Shop Manager, David Heckendorf.

Gerry Stilp will start a review of the parish facilities and how we use them.

We are on track to have a mission and vision by December with goals and objectives by January. Resources can then be aligned to put the plan into action. We need to be prepared to start a new Archdiocesan capital campaign at this time next year.

We passed the 400 mark for Mass attendance on the weekend. Staff is working on a communications plan for attendance at Christmas Mass. We will emphasize an active Christmas with parishioners attending Mass on the weekend or a weekday rather than crowding the 4:00 Christmas Eve Mass.

Finance report – Tom Mullooly

Although the final numbers are not in yet, it is expected that the Gala will be a financial success. While attendance was lower, there was a lot of participation with online bidding

Bereavement Mass and Breakfast – Greg Gundzik

The Bereavement Mass will be on Sunday, November 7th at the 9:00 AM Mass with breakfast following. The Pastoral Council hosts this event. Gary Heun has additional volunteers from the religious education program.

Liaison Updates

The August minutes reflect that Paul Conradson is the liaison for the School Committee and the Athletic Association. Terri Alioto is the liaison for Home and School. The September minutes reflect that Terri also will be the liaison for Women of St. Jude.

Athletic Association. Paul reported that basketball and volleyball are starting and the renovation of the old gym with a new floor is completed.

Human Concerns. The Human Concerns Committee has had a relationship with the MacCanon Brown Homeless Sanctuary (MBHS) since 2017. There is interest in formalizing an agreement for a collaborative ministry with

the Homeless Sanctuary. Confirmation students will be touring the facility and Father Mike can arrange for the Council to tour. Sister MacCanon Brown does not have full occupancy of the building and services are provided from a tent until money is raised to complete the Welcome Center. There would be value in inviting Sister to speak at a Council meeting about her work.

Parish Planning

Tim Weiss reviewed the steps for the strategic planning process. The Council has completed its analysis of Strengths, Weaknesses, Opportunities, and Threats (SWOT). A handout with the responses to the quantitative questions on the survey was handed out. Word clouds for two of the questions were handed out and will be posted in the back of church. Tim described mission/vision and asked Council members to think about how the Parish Survey responses to the open-ended questions help provide clarity for our Parish mission and vision.

Mary Voelker reviewed the Survey process and introduced the parishioner volunteers who were trained to analyze the survey responses to the six open-ended questions. They were:

Question #1: Mary Pat Dries and Lucas Vebber. *What are two or three things you like best about St. Jude?*

Question #2: Mary Jo Mance and Julie Barber. *Describe one of your best memories of St. Jude school, church, or parish.*

Question #3: Mary Walz-Chojnacki and Peter Benz. *What qualities do you associate with your idea of an ideal parish?*

Question #4: Ann Hruz and Laura Ruesch. *What group or ministry would you like to see at St. Jude and why?*

Question #5: John Lamb and Sabine Cutting. *What would you like to see at St. Jude that we don't currently do, maybe something you experienced at another parish?*

Question #6: Colleen Wakefield and Beth Valdes. *St. Jude will be celebrating its centennial anniversary in 2028. What three words do you hope will describe St. Jude on its 100th birthday?*

After the reports on the question responses were presented, Father Mike thanked the parishioner volunteers present and those not present for the work they did to summarize the responses. The Council and the guests discussed the importance of the results and the need to find better ways of communicating. The Council officers will meet in advance of the Parish Annual meeting to draft the mission and vision.

The Parish Annual meeting is Wednesday, November 17th at 7:00 PM. The next Pastoral Council meeting will be on November 17th before or after the Annual meeting. Father Mike said the closing prayer.
