MARRIAGES

By appointment with priest at least 6 months in advance. You must be a registered member of the parish. Weddings are not scheduled during Lent.

SACRAMENT OF RECONCILIATION

The Sacrament of Reconciliation is available after the 8:15 AM Mass on Saturdays. Confessions are heard in the North Cry Room with the option of using a confessional screen or sitting face-to-face socially distanced from the priest. Those waiting for confession should line up in the center aisle of the church while maintaining social distance.

Reception of the Sacrament may also be requested by calling the parish office to make an appointment. Arrangements will be made for either the pastor or one of the resident Nigerian priests to assist you.

SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM

Parents of children for Baptism should be registered parish members. Contact Gary Heun to register and to schedule a date. Parent instruction class is required before Baptism. Classes are held on the first Wednesday evening of odd-numbered months.

Taking Stock

On this last day of the church liturgical year it is helpful to take stock of the impact that our year in God's grace has benefited us and our community. If we don't do this, we both lack gratitude and don't understand how membership in a church is so helpful.

COVID was obviously the biggest issue since Advent 2020. St. Jude Parish strived to protect lives while still carrying on our ministries. Many staff members, parents, and coaches who had so many responsibilities did a lot of praying to navigate this path. Many of us had very strong feelings but surrendered them to God so God could calm us and talk to us. Praise God we were able to minimize illnesses and deaths while not shrinking the school and faith formation programs. Our church attendance is around 2/3 our pre-pandemic levels and continuing to grow rapidly.

The parish said a loving goodbye and enthusiastic thank you to Fr. Charlie Conley after his many years of faith-filled care to St. Jude and the broader church. God inspired this outpouring of love for Fr. Charlie and all of the staff and key volunteer leaders that worked with him.

You have welcomed me kindly into St. Jude Parish and school. The Holy Spirit has you sharing your reasons for enthusiasm for this parish as well as your hopes and dreams for its future. We can soon have these insights into teams of workers with their clarity of goals to charge this parish into the future.

The parish solidified its commitment to the McCanon Brown Homeless Sanctuary with collections of needed items, commitment of more volunteers, and financial resources to finish their needed welcoming area. As of the publishing of this bulletin, we have over 1/2 of the needed \$33,900 collected for this purpose.

I could go on and on, but perhaps it would be wiser for every member of the body of Christ to name for themselves the difference this year of grace has made in their lives.

If we identify our shortcomings while doing this review, that is ok too. Next weekend we begin Advent and another year of grace. We need more Christ (Christmas) and therefore should identify the need for another year of liturgical life in the Body of Christ. Notice the many offerings for Advent and Christmas which are named in this bulletin.


