SACRAMENT OF THE SICK / COMMUNION FOR THE SICK

MARRIAGES

By appointment with priest at least 6 months in advance. You must be a registered member of the parish. Weddings are not scheduled during Lent.

SACRAMENT OF RECONCILIATION

The Sacrament of Reconciliation is available after the 8:15 AM Mass on Saturdays. Confessions are heard in the North Cry Room with the option of using a confessional screen or sitting face-to-face socially distanced from the priest. Those waiting for confession should line up in the center aisle of the church while maintaining social distance.

Reception of the Sacrament may also be requested by calling the parish office to make an appointment. Arrangements will be made for either the pastor or one of the resident Nigerian priests to assist you.

SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM

Parents of children for Baptism should be registered parish members. Contact Gary Heun to register and to schedule a date. Parent instruction class is required before Baptism. Classes are held on the first Wednesday evening of odd-numbered months.

Fulfilling the Promise

We teach our children and remind ourselves of the covenants that God made with us. First the commitment at the time of Noah that God will not destroy us. Secondly through Abraham that God will make children as numerous as the stars of the sky and provide for us. Thirdly, through Jesus, God establishes a new covenant for the forgiveness of sins.

The first words to us as we start Advent are this, through the prophet Jeremiah: "The days are coming, says the Lord, when I will fulfill the promise I made to the house of Israel and Judah."

Our Gospel speaks to us of profound fear that our time on earth is limited but this warning does not negate God's covenants. People without faith in the God of these covenants might indeed "die of fright" but we wish to be the people that "stand before the Son of Man".

Much of the conflict between us and even within us is the result of fear. We are afraid of suffering and dying, we are afraid of being teased and being mocked, we are afraid our life is unimportant and we are afraid that we will be found to be frauds. Advent is a time of soul searching and examination of conscience to find within ourselves, somewhere beyond our fears, the faith that God will not destroy us, and will give us many future generations, and will even forgive us.

We need to move beyond the "anxieties of daily life" in order to do this. Of course this is hard as we prepare for and start celebrating the holidays. Hopefully you find in this bulletin many possibilities to appreciate the next generation and trust God even with your sins. Pray about how God is trying to fulfill his covenant by taking care of you and then pick from this list one or two ways to start.

We need not die of fright but trust instead that God is fulfilling his promises.


Advent Wreath Candle Lighting

Thank you for your generous donation to the Andean Health & Development. Our communities, Santo Domingo and Pedro Vicente Maldonado, have felt the devastating effects of the coronavirus, but our Ecuadorian staff has valiantly forged ahead to fulfill AHD's mission.

Our residency class of family physicians is back in session. The doctors who graduate from this rigorous program teach future classes, and it's this multiplier effect that improves Ecuador's health system for the long term. These doctors are also conducting public health research at our Andean Health Institute, sharing their global health experiences with the rest of the developing world.

The public health crisis reminds us how vital investments in local infrastructure and community-led programs are for low-income communities. The vaccine is now available in many parts of the country, but the rollout has been slow. Morale remains high at our hospitals, and we will continue to provide the highest quality care to Covid-19 patients and routine patients alike.
