

#### **MARRIAGES**

By appointment with priest at least 6 months in advance. You must be a registered member of the parish. Weddings are not scheduled during Lent.

#### SACRAMENT OF RECONCILIATION

The Sacrament of Reconciliation is available after the 8:15 AM Mass on Saturdays. Confessions are heard in the North Cry Room with the option of using a confessional screen or sitting face-to-face socially distanced from the priest. Those waiting for confession should line up in the center aisle of the church while maintaining social distance.

Reception of the Sacrament may also be requested by calling the parish office to make an appointment. Arrangements will be made for either the pastor or one of the resident Nigerian priests to assist you.

#### SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM

Parents of children for Baptism should be registered parish members. Contact Gary Heun to register and to schedule a date. Parent instruction class is required before Baptism. Classes are held on the first Wednesday evening of oddnumbered months.

#### The New Normal?

The Economist magazine published an excellent article on December 18<sup>th</sup>, 2021 entitled "The New Normal". In it they comment on our love of 1990's music to remember the days when "suits were oversized, work ended when people left the office, and the internet was not yet disrupting cozy, established industries or stoking the outrage machine that has supplanted public discourse". All of these changes, that have so altered our lives, are unnerving and make it hard to see the future.

Our readings though, state that during the millennia of the prophets and the time of Jesus, "darkness covered the earth, and thick clouds covered the peoples; but upon you the Lord shines, and over you appears his glory." (Is 60:1-6) The darkness had covered King Herod, who was afraid of the new king and therefore planned violence. The three magi trusted the changes of the future and offered their gifts to this change.

Once every seven years the celebration of the Epiphany lands on New Year's Day so we gain from this juxtaposition. Can we take this opportunity to name the changes that have most affected us? Then, let us pray about our gifts and name how they can be used in a new way.

Most certainly we can take these days to discern our mission in life and to write it down. Then as we enter the time of rapid changes, we will not so easily

new epiphany, which will help us set a new direction, which includes the presence of God, who gives us peace.

## Volunteers Needed for Ft. McCoy

Catholic Charities agencies are mobilizing personnel, volunteers, and resources to provide refugees at Ft. McCoy with a welcoming atmosphere, a break from the confines of temporary housing, and relief from their difficult journey. Among the services provided are on-base legal assistance, social engagement for women and children, and learning centers. The women's centers provide a quiet and clean place for mothers to bond and play with their children and develop friendships. The children's area is a place for children to gather and create arts and craft projects, build puzzles, play games and be sociable. Volunteers are crucial to keep the centers running smoothly and safely.

The USCCB and Catholic Charities are seeking more volunteers to aid in this mission. Volunteers will spend time at one of the three Women and Children Centers, two Sewing Centers or Learning Center. Each of the centers requires between 6-10 volunteers to operate. Individuals must be able to commit to a minimum of three days.
