By appointment with priest at least 6 months in advance. You must be a registered member of the parish. Weddings are not scheduled during Lent.

SACRAMENT OF RECONCILIATION

The Sacrament of Reconciliation is available after the 8:15 AM Mass on Saturdays. Confessions are heard in the North Cry Room with the option of using a confessional screen or sitting face-to-face socially distanced from the priest. Those waiting for confession should line up in the center aisle of the church while maintaining social distance.

Reception of the Sacrament may also be requested by calling the parish office to make an appointment. Arrangements will be made for either the pastor or one of the resident Nigerian priests to assist you.

SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM

Parents of children for Baptism should be registered parish members. Contact Gary Heun to register and to schedule a date. Parent instruction class is required before Baptism. Classes are held on the first Wednesday evening of odd-numbered months.

Using All Three Eyes

Richard Rohr in his book *The Naked Now, Learning to See as the Mystics See* (2009) reminds his readers of the old church teaching about seeing the world from three levels of depth: the physical, the intellectual, and the spiritual, which are traditionally named the three eyes. This insight is important for this weekend's Gospel of the Wedding at Cana from the Gospel of John.

The first eye would physically experience this miracle from the delicious taste of the wine and the relief experienced by the wedding couple. The second eye would intellectually understand that Jesus is greater than the prophets of old and that this story is explaining the gift of the new sacraments, especially the Eucharist, over the old rituals of our faith. But the third eye would open our hearts to experience this Eucharistic presence now with the openness that would lead to our union with God.

As we launch into another year of grace, we are called to be open to all three levels of grace: from the immediate joy of experiencing friendship and music at Mass, to intellectually agreeing to Jesus Christ as the Lord of our life, to our truly being open to his love in our hearts and genuinely inviting union.

On December 28th I began feeling a bronchial cough and some fatigue kicking in. I tried finding a COVID test but none was available until Sunday evening, January 2nd, when I could finally test and find out I had COVID. The first level was to pay attention to my health and to the latest signs of omicron. The second eye realized, unfortunately belatedly, that I need to isolate because I didn't want to spread this illness even though I wasn't very sick. The third eye had me realizing the spiritual gift of it all: to slow down, be at home, simplify, clean, and pray more. Even COVID, for me with a light case, was a gift toward union.

By the way, I share this information with a level of embarrassment and concern that I didn't understand my health condition sooner and may have spread the illness to others. This is exactly why I wear a mask while praying over the Eucharist and distributing the Eucharist, even though people point out that I'm the only priest doing so. Learning you have COVID always comes too late as you are infectious days before having any symptoms much less a positive test result. This humility is another case to be considered: with the first eye humility is painful, with the second eye we know it's intellectually necessary, and with the third eye we see how it connects us to the loving wounds of Jesus Christ.

Additional Option for Tornado Relief

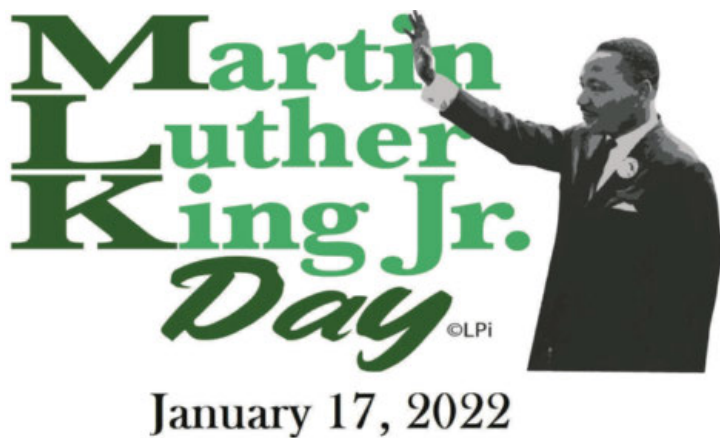

The following letter was sent to Pastors/Parish Directors, Directors of Administrative Services, Religious Education Leaders and School Principals.

As we continue to learn to live with COVID-19 in our midst, and adjust to the changing variants, I want to thank you for your leadership and diligence in continuing the protocols already in place to help people feel safe while attending Mass. The protocols include providing clearly designated areas for mask wearing and social distancing, hand sanitizer and extra cleaning, and making sure that staff and volunteers are incorporating these measures.

In addition, those who lead religious education, or who have scheduled other large parish meetings where social distancing options are not available, should consider postponing the meetings or changing them to virtual attendance for now.

While there has been no outbreak of COVID-19 from Mass attendance, I'd like to encourage people to exercise personal responsibility. Those who feel sick, or who are especially at risk of health complications, should stay home and watch Sunday worship on the many Masses broadcast on TV and live-streamed on social media until they feel comfortable returning to in-person Mass.

It would be helpful to remind parishioners that if a person is ill, taking care of someone who is sick, or is at risk of serious illness due to exposure, their Sunday Mass attendance is excused.

Our Sunday worship is a joyful obligation. It is a witness to God as the priority in our lives. By remaining diligent in these ways, we help ensure our parishioners feel safe attending Mass and can continue experiencing the connectedness of our parish communities, which is such a vital part of our lives.
