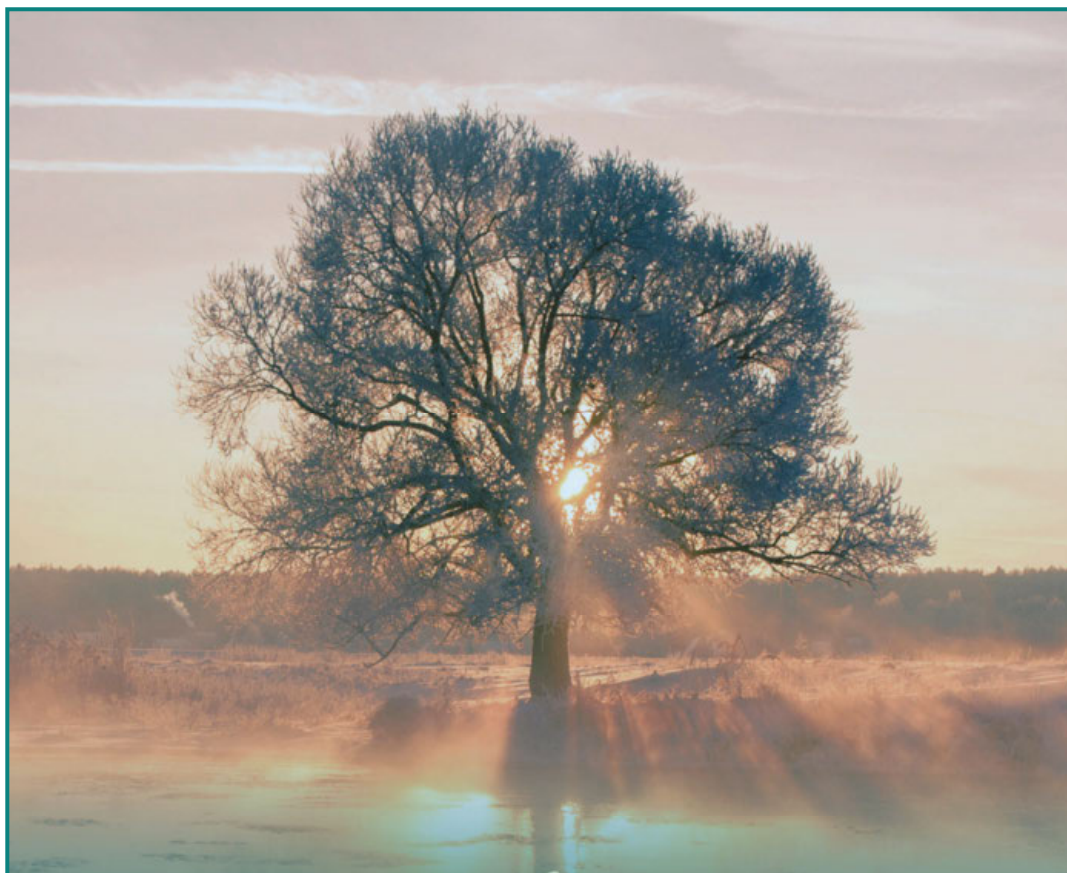

Marriages

By appointment with priest at least 6 months in advance. You must be a registered member of the parish. Weddings are not scheduled during Lent.

Sacrament of Reconciliation

The Sacrament of Reconciliation is available after the 8:15 AM Mass on Saturdays. Confessions are heard in the North Cry Room with the option of using a confessional screen or sitting face-to-face socially distanced from the priest. Those waiting for confession should line up in the center aisle of the church while maintaining social distance.

Reception of the Sacrament may also be requested by calling the parish office to make an appointment. Arrangements will be made for either the pastor or one of the resident Nigerian priests to assist you.

Sacrament of Baptism

Parents of children for Baptism should be registered parish members. Contact Gary Heun to register and to schedule a date. Parent instruction class is required before Baptism. Classes are held on the first Wednesday evening of odd-numbered months.

An Acceptable Year of the Lord

In this weekend's Gospel reading, Jesus is beginning his ministry after being in the desert. He enters the synagogue and as the Holy Spirit arranged, the scroll of the prophet Isaiah was handed him regarding an acceptable year of the Lord. Jesus reads its lines about bringing gladness to the poor, liberty to captives, sight to the blind and freedom for the oppressed. He ends by sitting quietly till everybody was looking at him and then finished by saying, "Today this scripture passage is fulfilled in your hearing."

If you come across someone that wonders why you are a Christian, this is the moment in the Bible you need to tell them about. If people are feeling poor, or captive or blind or oppressed – looking and listening to Jesus is our path to being encouraged, seeing clearly and feeling free.

Paul the apostle is an example of this transformation. In today's second reading from his *First Letter to the Corinthians*, he is talking about a radical equality of all gifts of the Holy Spirit and between the greatest and smallest person. He did not start life believing this. He thought that he and others were better due to their education and orthodox adherence to the faith. He went so far in this lack of sight that he was a party to oppression, physical abuse, and murder of people smaller than him. It is a natural human problem to want to be better than other people. Curiously whether we perceive ourselves as better or worse than others we are held captive. Looking into the eyes of Jesus was the path out of this for Paul to the radical freedom he names in the letter to the Corinthians.

We are all tempted to feel superior to other people or feel trapped below the oppression of superior people; this can happen because of education level, wealth level, political affiliation, not yet being born, having dementia, and many other circumstances. Let us look into the eyes of Christ and join this acceptable year of the Lord. By looking into his eyes, we can feel so loved and secure in ourselves that we are permanently encouraged, understand our path, and feel freedom which cannot be given or taken by others. With the humbling experience of Jesus as our brother, no other person will appear smaller or larger than us.

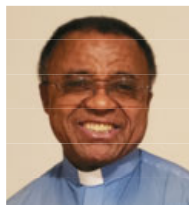

Father Mike said the opening prayer. The minutes of the November Annual meeting and Pastoral Council meeting were approved.

Pastor's report – Father Mike

Christmas programs proceeded this year and the church looked very impressive despite the fact that Covid continues. Father could never have predicted the amount of time he and Catherine LaDien spend on Covid matters for the school. In response to a question on Covid in church, Father noted that using tape on the pews to indicate areas where masks are required and where they are optional makes it easy to change boundaries. Important work now is parish planning which we will talk about tonight.

Finance report – Tom Mullooly

There has not been a Finance Committee meeting so nothing to report.

Parish Planning**Mission and Vision – Father Mike**

The parish staff noted that “welcoming” was not a part of the draft Mission statement. After discussion, it was included and the Mission and Vision were approved to read as follows:

It was recommended that the Mission and Vision statements be on the parish website and at the back of church. The mission can be a regular part of the parish bulletin and at the top of every agenda for the Pastoral Council.

Youth Survey Responses – Peter Benz

The youth survey responses were summarized by Mary Pat Dries (Question #1), Julie Barber (Question #2), Mary Walz-Chojnacki (Question #3), Laura Ruesch (Question #4), John Lamb (Question #5), and Beth Valdes (Question #6).

Peter presented an overview of the responses noting that they are very positive about the parish. The sense of community and participation, valuing inclusivity, wanting to volunteer and give back were themes common to both the youth and adult responses. Students are happy with the quality of education and this was important to them. In terms of improvement, the youth suggest a focus on youth ministry, diversity with music, and opportunities to be actively involved with the liturgy.

Brainstorming Goals – Father Mike and Tim Weiss

Father Mike noted that good decisions can only be made with good options. A large list of options makes it easier to make decisions and establish priorities for the strategic plan. Father Mike presented his ideas and the Council members and guests brainstormed additional ideas. After brainstorming, Tim noted that a strategic plan starts with broad goals that are more fully described with objectives. Action plans are then generated for each of the objectives. Mary Voelker will write up the ideas and the Executive Committee will meet to plan how to get additional ideas and feedback on priorities from parish groups and parishioners.

Communication of Parish Survey Results

Peter Benz volunteered to take the lead on communicating the parish survey results along with the Mission and Vision statements. The parish *Flocknote*, weekly bulletin, parish website, school newsletter, and religious education can be used. Father Mike suggested a hospitality after Mass in the cafeteria. This would also be an opportunity for parishioners to identify their priorities for goals.

Father Mike said a closing prayer and the meeting adjourned at 8:40 PM. The next Pastoral Council meeting will be on February 23, 2022 at 7:00 in the Activity Center and on Zoom.


