

### Palm Sunday of the Passion of the Lord

On Palm Sunday we hear two readings from the Gospel, one at the beginning of the liturgy commemorating Jesus' entrance into Jerusalem and another one narrating His passion. Taken together, both readings confront us with two very different crowds. One crowd followed Jesus into Jerusalem proclaiming Him to be the king, crying out- *blessed is He who comes in the name of the Lord*. Another crowd called Him a criminal and during His trial screamed- *away with this man! Crucify Him and release Barabbas to us*.

Scripture tells us, and experience makes plain to us, that not everyone calls Jesus- the king. For many, this week is just like any other week. But as Christians, with the eyes of faith, we call this week "holy."

This Sunday, this first day of Holy Week, is called "Palm Sunday" because of the palms we carry in our hands. We imitate the crowds which followed Jesus into Jerusalem, calling Him our king. When we take our palms home and place them in a crucifix or hang them on the wall, we call to mind which crowd we seek to belong. Like the crowds that laid everything at His feet as He strode into the city, we call Him king.

But even the crowd carrying palms that followed Jesus into Jerusalem would have their vision of Christ's kingship clarified. And the same occurs for us each Holy Week. Our understanding of Christ's kingship is purified, revealing to us a king who paradoxically reigns on a cross yet claims the victory over sin and death.

This Thursday, at the Mass of the Lord's Supper, we will witness that our king came to serve, to wash His disciples' feet. We will taste and see the institution of the most Holy Eucharist and the priesthood. Later in the same evening, we will keep watch with Him in the garden and see Him betrayed.

On Good Friday we fulfill our responsibility to fast. At the liturgy, we solemnly pray for the entire world, and venerate the holy cross.


On Holy Saturday, the Church is still, and quiet, until the solemn Easter Vigil where we hear the Good News of His resurrection and we initiate members into the Body of Christ, the Church.

For some, this week is just any other week, but that does not keep us from calling this week "holy," and letting it teach us the identity of our savior and king, Jesus Christ.


