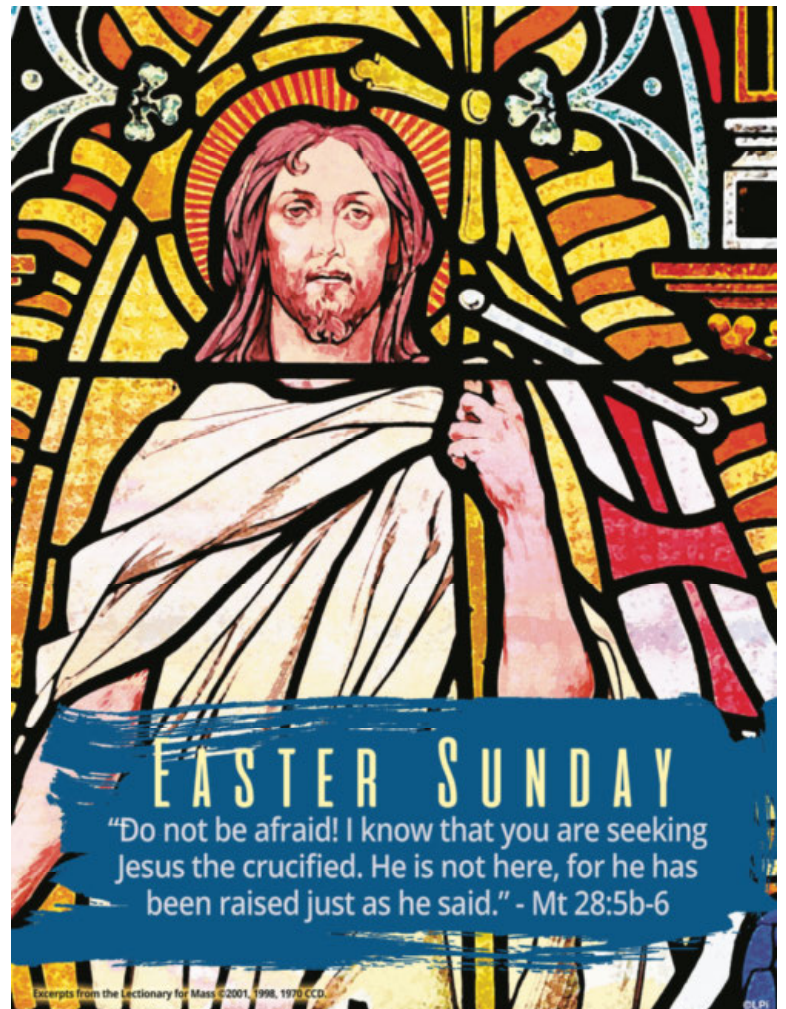

Easter Sunday of the Resurrection of the Lord

Brothers and Sisters, a few years ago, on Holy Thursday, at the Mass of the Lord's Supper, I accidentally did more than wash feet. In some ways, one could say that I started washing floors.

You may now the ritual well. There is a part of the Liturgy where the priest removes his chasuble (the outer garment worn for Mass) and washes the feet of individuals, imitating what Jesus did at the Last Supper. Well, during the washing of the feet, I spilled the water that was in my basin. I dropped the basin and the water sloshed out, down the steps of the sanctuary and into my alb- it was a mess.

From my vantage point, it was a slow-motion disaster. The moment the basin began to slip I could see the mess in my mind's eye before it actually unfolded. I think we have all had that experience- watching things fall apart in slow motion. Once the water spilled over the steps, got into the cracks, I knew there was no amount of human effort that could put the water back in the basin where it belonged. The damage was irreversible. What was supposed to stay together, was separated. What was united, was scattered.

In a small way, the water I spilled is an image of what destruction is. Destruction is to *de-structure*. To take apart what was together. To tear apart and rend asunder what was meant to be kept together. On Good Friday, we came to grips with the fact that on the cross, Jesus' flesh and Blood were torn apart. Jesus died.

The definition of death is the separation of the soul from the body. The two are meant to be together. Even though our bodies undergo so many changes in this life, we know in our soul that it is "I" that endures despite the physical changes. And the emotions we experience in our souls are felt with our bodies: our heart races, we get lumps in our throats, we laugh and we cry. Our bodies and our souls are meant to be together as a whole. But death destroys that unity.

At the peak of its destruction, death wrests the soul from the body. Once separated, it's hard to imagine them being brought back together. And the task looks impossible if we cannot even put spilled water back into a basin.

Indeed, until Jesus' resurrection, death *had* an eternal character to it. But friends here is the Good News, here is the mystery that we proclaim as Christians, that the Church has received from eyewitnesses and has passed on for two thousand years.

By Christ's death, His real death, and by His rising from the dead, Jesus transformed what should have been an eternal loss into something bound by time: 3 days. By His resurrection from the dead, Jesus literally transformed death, the ultimate scattering of soul and body, into life, and life that is eternal.

If Jesus can transform death into life. If He can take upon Himself the destruction of death, the rending of flesh from blood, the soul from the body, and reunite them in His risen body, then truly there is nothing impossible for God. In this way, the emptiness of the tomb fills our hearts with hope.

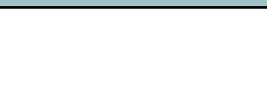

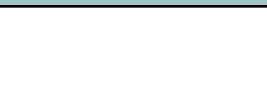
