

When I was a kid, from time to time my grandmother jokingly said to me, "If you keep crying, I will let a tiger come and get you." I didn't understand why she said this weird thing to me. Asking myself, 'What? A tiger is

coming to get me?' Anyhow I stopped crying.



About 10 years ago, when I began digging into the modern history of Korea, I was shocked by the fact that Korean Tigers, more often known as Siberian Tigers, literally lived in every nook and cranny of the Korean

Peninsula. That was the reason why Korea's traditional fairy tales talk about Tigers over and over again. Then, you may ask me: Where have those tigers gone? First, during Japan's occupation, Japanese soldiers began to extensively capture Korean tigers to make money with the tiger skin. It was far more than a hunting. They made use of military strategies to capture as many tigers as possible. Second, it is the Korean War that removed all Korean tigers that had survived the Japanese occupation from the peninsula. During 1950-1953, about 635,000 tons of bomb were dropped on Korea, not counting 32,557 tons of napalm. Don't be surprised that, in the entire Pacific theater in World War II, about 503,000 tons of bomb were dropped (Bruce Cuming, The Korean War, p. 159). That was why I couldn't resonate with my grandmother who mentioned a Korean tiger. She had grown and lived with it. But, I didn't. According to the lunar calendar, 2022 is the Year of Black Tiger. At present, there are almost no tigers in and around the Korean Peninsula. But, Koreans sincerely hope that Black Tiger helps and guides their 2022 with its mysterious power of courage, wisdom, and generosity.

At the beginning of this year, we all hopefully said to one another, "Happy New Year!" But, what we are facing now is the Omicron Variant that immediately put the US back in the chaotic situation we were all terrified with two year ago.

A few days ago I got two emails with regard to Covid one from the Wisconsin Council of Churches and the other from the Wisconsin Conference of the UMC. The WI Council of Churches urgently asked us to temporarily go back to remote worship if possible, bringing our attention to the gravity of Covid. Our conference also took the same stance, yet at the same time carefully suggested our church make Covid Guidelines and adhere to them. What relieved me after going over their suggestions is that most of them are already being observed by Portage UMC. It hints that many churches out there do not have such Covid Guidelines. Let us keep in mind that, until we eventually get out of this long and dark tunnel of Covid, we are consistently required to sacrifice our freedom to pursue personal happiness to some degree. From a different point of view, however, I think this could be a time when Christians can show how to care for one another to their neighbors.

There are teachers... and then there are Educators.




