

DEACON DAVE'S DESK

Just an Ordinary Sunday

This past Monday, after the Baptism of the Lord ended the Christmas season, we took down all the wonderful Christmas decorations and the church's calendar began Ordinary Time. These ordinary weeks are defined as those falling outside any of the other liturgical seasons when we are either fasting or feasting. These numbered weeks, however, should be anything but ordinary or unimportant.

Ordinary Time occurs in two parts. The short period we just started between the seasons of Christmas and Lent are like a "warm-up" to the weeks of ordinary time that follow the Easter season carrying us from spring through summer and into fall. So despite the short days, white snow, artic blast and gray skies of winter, ordinary time will be marked by green liturgical colors to represent hope and inspire growth. As the days grow longer and warmer, we shift our focus towards the planting and building that can take place in our spiritual and earthly lives. We are now invited to call the Lord into our "ordinary" days as the scriptures emphasize Jesus' extraordinary life and miraculous deeds while He lived among us.

Our daily lives—even during the pandemic—are noisy, cluttered, and riddled with distractions. Often we have to strain to hear the whispering voice of God and it is helpful—to me, at least—to create some structured quiet time to hear and discern God's call. Maybe Samuel's plight is familiar to you, too. Here is a short list of ways that help me lower the volume on my life.

- Add a daily mass to the weekly routine.
- Go to confession BEFORE Lent to make the most out of that holy season.
- Be more consistent in praying daily.
- Read and REFLECT on scripture daily.
- Stop by the church for just a few minutes in quite prayer.
- Experience Christ in the Blessed Sacrament, especially at Adoration on Thursday.

I am grateful to work in a job where the ultimate mission is to bring the Gospel to life in the world. It is a privilege for me to be in such proximity to such a peaceful worship space like our church. As most of you know I like the winter, the snow on the ground, the freshness of the cold air reminds me of the fresh start we get as we begin a new year, and my goal this year is to be more like Samuel and say "Here I am, Lord. You called me. Speak, for your servant is listening." But the world is noisy and I tend to be hard of hearing sometimes...
