DEACON DAVE'S DESK

We are two weeks away from Easter. We have journeyed through Temptation (First Sunday) to Transfiguration (Second Sunday); from Repentance (Third Sunday) to Reconciliation (Fourth Sunday). We have arrived at the Fifth Sunday of Lent. The Gospel today is found in the Gospel according to John. Jesus is teaching the people in the temple area when the Pharisees and scribes bring a woman to him who has been caught committing adultery. They remind Jesus that the Law of Moses commanded the stoning of a woman caught committing adultery, but they want to know what he will say.

The Pharisees and scribes think they have the perfect plan to trap Jesus. If he tells them not to stone her, but instead forgive her, then they will condemn him for not following the Law that God gave to Moses in Deuteronomy. If he tells them to follow the Law and stone her, they will say, "But you have forgiven others, why not her?"

They are not expecting the answer he gives, "Let the one among you who is without sin be the first to throw a stone at her." Notice the ones who leave first, the elders. Why is this important? The elders had been around long enough to know the Law of God. But they had also been around long enough to know what is in their hearts. They know what Jesus is telling them, to look into their hearts and see the times they have sinned. They are wise and honest enough to acknowledge that they are not without sin. Once the elders leave, it's a powerful example to the rest of the people to look into their hearts and see their sinfulness.

Jesus is left alone with the woman. Now it is his turn to ask the questions, "Woman, where are they? Has no one condemned you?" She replies, "No one, sir." Jesus then says, "Neither do I condemn you. Go, and from now on do not sin any more."

What Jesus tells this woman is what he tells each of us, "I forgive you, but do not sin anymore." Jesus sees her as a child of God who with God's help can avoid sin of any kind. Jesus wants her to see what a beautiful gift we have if we live the life God asks us to live. Jesus frees her from her sin and places his grace, goodness, and life within her. This is what he does for each of us. So let us acknowledge our sins and allow our Lord to free us from our sins and fill us with his grace, goodness, and life
