

I Hope I Am Like Him

"Who is this Christ? Is he like you?"

Perhaps you've heard this story, often attributed to the life of St. Teresa of Calcutta. A sick man asked her this question, as he marveled at her tireless service to himself and others in the name of someone named Jesus Christ. "He is nothing like me," the saint is said to have answered. "But I hope I am like him."

Though the authenticity of this exchange cannot be verified, its message rings perfectly true: all the value of our stewardship lies in its relativity to the one in whose name we perform it.

Consider the figure of John the Baptist — a magnificent, towering character even purely from a literary or historical perspective. A martyr who fed on wild locusts and boldly spoke truth to power - a man so great some mistook him for the Messiah.

But why is he great? Because he prepared the way. All his accomplishments and escapades mean nothing if they are taken out of the context of salvation history. He only makes sense relative to Christ — and this is exactly as he wanted it. "One worthier than I is coming," he insists. And because of that humility and that total embrace of God's will, he is given one of the greatest honors in the New Testament — he baptizes the Son of God.

Let's examine our lives in the light of their relativity to Christ. How do we prepare the way? When Christ comes to us, what do we do? How do we leave ourselves open to be actors in God's plan?

How Important is a Church Registration?

When you go to a doctor, a school, a dentist, etc. you fill out a form to "register" your information. The same is true for the church you attend.

The parish needs accurate information about you and/or your family, in our registration files to be able to communicate information from time to time.

For example:

-If you have been asked to be a Godparent at another parish and you need a letter of membership from the parish priest. **He's going to look for your registration in our files.** (*Father does a pretty good job of remembering MOST people, but he can't always place an unfamiliar name with a face*)

-If you are going to be married and need your Sacrament records; We look in the files for your registration.

-If you are sick and the hospital calls us and says you are member of our parish and we don't recognize your name. We look for your information in the files.

-If you are listed under your parents registration and have recently moved out of the family home-You will need to fill out a registration form for yourself.


The registration form tells us that you want to be an active member of our parish family. It also verifies information about your Catholic Sacraments that you have received. We just need to know if you are a fully initiated Catholic. You do not have to have the exact dates to fill out the form...just a yes or no will suffice.

When you fill out a form at a doctor, dentist or school you are asked for payment information. When you register with the parish, the same thing happens, you will be asked how you wish to donate. Registering allows you to tell us how you wish to share your time, treasure and talents, to further our community's growth.

We have a wonderful parish and we would like to include you as an active registered member of our family.


