

From the Desk of Fr. Justin...



Hello and welcome to the fourth and final bulletin article regarding authority. We'll wrap all this up with an address on what we gain from authority, when all things in life are working appropriately. So with the insight of the past two articles, let's assume an authority figure is responsible for their actions, focuses on appropriate matters that they are knowledgeable of, and they have no use for threats or ultimatums. Furthermore, they care about the well-being of their people, they are capable of explaining the reason behind their decisions, and are secure enough in themselves to resist caving in to the demands of others. How does that person contribute to the greater whole?

The long-and-short of the answer is that authority is a part of the greater whole of society. Authority provides the good guidance and direction in leadership, which is something we all absolutely need whether we acknowledge it or not. Although it is currently an unfashionable thing to say these days, a healthy society requires hearty amounts of obedience, humility, and confident leadership. We all need obedience in our lives, because "obedience" means "to listen": we all need to listen to someone about something. Imagine the foolishness of a person who does not listen to a police officer when he says that a certain place is unsafe for travel. We also need humility in life, because we are rarely the most knowledgeable person in the room regarding a

certain subject... and we are never the most knowledgeable person in the room regarding all subjects! We need humility to comprehend the fact that we do not always have the answers. When we live out our own authority while also acknowledging the authority of others, we open ourselves up to good leadership: that is, leadership from a proper source. We have good reason to listen when someone in authority speaks.

When authority is not acknowledged or is poorly expressed, others are deprived of the chance to live out the values of obedience and humility. When there is no legitimate authority, there is no legitimate leadership... and people do not flourish in the absence of leadership. Many people will champion the values of anarchism or "for the people by the people" leadership-less organizations, but they rarely deliver good results for long. We all need leadership in our lives, and authority is the key to making that leadership authentic and helpful. We look to our medical professionals for leadership regarding what is healthy. We look to our politicians to lead us in matters of legislation and judicial matters. We look to the clergy for matters of the spirit and to our parents for... well... for just about everything!

So the next time you hear that word "authority", think about how badly we need good leadership in life. Think about how any

crackpot with a big mouth can feign authority when no true leadership can be found. Think about a subject of which you are relatively ignorant, and think about the sort of person you'd like to trust with respect to that subject. You are surely likely to think of someone who has done their research, invested in your well-being, and uncorrupted by unrelated outside influences.

Amen, amen, I say to you: it is a great gift to have proper authority figures in life: those who charismatically guide and offer direction, that we are not caught defenseless in the face of people and ideologies who do not so much lead as manipulate.

I will end with the question that started this whole thing a month ago. "On whose authority?" That is a useful question to have in the back of your head. When you are told something that somewhat rubs you the wrong way, don't brainlessly accept it on face-value. That's gullibility. On the other hand, don't throw it away as nonsense: that's ignorance and stubbornness. Instead, question the source: is it trustworthy and credible? On whose authority does it all truly rest?



St. Frances Xavier Cabrini (1850 – 1917) was the first United States citizen to become a saint. Known for her deep trust in God, she was a courageous woman doing the work of Christ.

She focused her charitable work at the House of Providence Orphanage in Cadogno, Italy, and in 1877, professed vows there and took the religious habit.

When the bishop closed the orphanage in 1880, he named St. Frances Xavier Cabrini prioress of the Missionary Sisters of the Sacred Heart. Pope Leo XIII urged her to see the need in the west. She traveled with six of her fellow religious sisters to New York City, where they worked with the thousands of Italian immigrants residing there.

When she arrived in New York, the house intended to be her first orphanage in the United States was not available. Rather than come back to Italy, she instead found a way to establish that orphanage elsewhere - plus a few more. Throughout her life, she is known for founding 67 institutions dedicated to caring for the poor, the abandoned, the uneducated, and the sick. She died of malaria in her own Columbus Hospital in Chicago in 1917.




