





Maddening Love By Carolyn Steeno

At an early age our son, Ethan, *ran* – and he was fast. If we weren't holding him with an iron grip when we went shopping, he'd disappear in an instant.

To burn off his energy, we took him to *The Big Event for Little Kids* at the Brown Co. Arena. Once inside the door, we had to stop a moment to get our bearings. And suddenly, we were one kid short.

In today's Gospel, Jesus went missing too, but Jesus was twelve. Ethan was *maybe* four. People everywhere, tables and displays – and the noise! How do you find a little kid in all that?

Utter panic hit me. I was scared, disoriented – and I was *MAD*!

Mary and Joseph had to deal with that *for 3 days*. It was only about 30 minutes for us – it just *felt* like 3 days!

What relief when we found him! And how I wanted to *kill* the little roadrunner! Yet, it was easier to control myself when he ran into my arms, scared and recalcitrant. But how did Mary and Joseph hold back when Jesus asked why they didn't know he'd be in his Father's house?

How is it that we're most compelled to seriously injure those we love the most? How often do our families take the brunt of our frustrations? Where can we go with our strong emotions, especially when we're feeling violent?

Release it to God. It's OK to yell, scream, rant, and shake your fists at Him – He can take it.

On this Day of the Holy Family, pray that family members refrain from physically hurting one another. And pray that missing children are returned to their families quickly.
