


#### **Winter Time Reminders**

#### HOPE

In Luke's gospel for today, the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord, we hear that the people are "asking in their hearts whether John (the Baptist) might be the Christ." From our modern perspective, we might think this to be a foolish question. We were raised in a Faith that is over twenty centuries old and leaves no doubt (hopefully) that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of the Living God. So why would these people be so confused?

The Jewish people at the time of Jesus and John were in great difficulty, both in politics and religion. They were living in a country that was occupied and ruled by a foreign power, namely Rome. The leaders of their own religion had also made it very difficult for them to follow the rigid laws they believed to be necessary to be people of faith. They needed hope that somehow they would be delivered from their difficulties and enjoy the life they believed they should have as children of God. So, it would make sense that anybody who came along proclaiming the Kingdom of God might be the one they were waiting for.

Here we are today. Modern technology has made it so easy to have and to do seemingly anything we put our minds to. Yet isn't it true that we're trapped? We have this global pandemic that seems to ebb and flow. making us almost schizophrenic, going from thinking everything's going to be OK to finding out that there's another new variant waiting to confuse medical science. We have tensions growing between nations of the world. In our own country, our political "leaders" seem to be more interested in party loyalty than in serving the people. What are we to do? Where's the hope in all this?
