Deacon Jeff's Corner

As we begin what is known as "Ordinary" Time (meaning numbered) in our liturgical year, we hear the story today of Jesus' very first recorded miracle: The Wedding Feast at Cana, where he turns water into the most magnificent wine.

I recall what happened on February 22, 1980, when the United States Olympic Hockey team defeated the supposedly unbeatable Russians in what is still known as the "Miracle on Ice". The fact that the US beat a team far superior to them is still considered to be a miracle and maybe it was! The point I'm trying to make is that back when Jesus walked the earth as a human, he performed many miracles to show that he *was* God. Some people believed him; many did not. Today when something totally out of the ordinary happens, many refuse to acknowledge that it could be an act of God. Instead, they fall back on the science behind the event or that it is simply a coincidence.

Our faith tells us that Jesus performed miracles 2000 years ago but he also said he would always stay with us. Why is it so hard to believe Jesus delivers miracles today? All we have to do is look around, because my friends, miracles happen every day! What we need to do is have the faith to be open to miracles. When something out of the ordinary does happen to recognize Jesus may, in fact, be allowing us to see that no matter what you read, hear, or watch, God is in control. Unfortunately, it is us who fail to recognize God's presence in the daily activities of our lives. Maybe it's time to look around and realize all the good of the earth and in our lives that God wants us to experience – even through miracles! **Deacon Jeff**

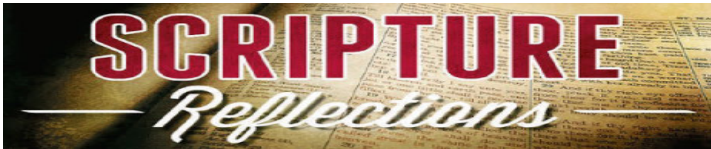

What Relationships Have To Do With Wine

WOW! The celebrations of Advent and Christmas Seasons are over and now we begin 8 weeks of Ordinary Time. What exactly is Ordinary time? First, an obvious change is the color. The decorations are put away and green is the prominent color in the church, signifying hope and new life. Second, we remember “All time belongs to Him”. This season takes its name from the ‘ordinal numbers’ (first, second, third and so on) that are used to count the Sundays and weeks throughout this period we call Ordinary Time.

During this period of time we learn about the everyday life of Jesus Christ. We see how Jesus embraced His humanity and divinity walking on this land with His parents and disciples, modeling, serving and sharing stories to help all of us grow in our relationships, and faith.

In today’s Gospel, we hear about Jesus’ first miracle at the Wedding in Cana. Was it to show us the importance of our relationship with God and our faith? Maybe. The dictionary defines faith as: confidence or trust in a person, thing, or concept, a belief in God. Perhaps it was our need for prayer, and our relationship with Mary and intercessory prayer (praying for others) or, was it to show the importance of family relationships?

Mary trusted her son and knew what he could do. After all, she was his mother. She interceded on behalf of her family friend saying to Jesus, *“They have no wine.”* And Jesus with respect to his mother said to her, *“Woman, how does your concern affect me? My hour has not yet come.”* His mother said to the servers, *“Do whatever he tells you.”* Jesus did what his mother asked and transformed the water into the best wine they had tasted, *“...and so revealed His glory, and His disciples began to believe in Him.”*

Jesus used this ordinary event to build relationships. How do we use these ordinary times to build relationships in our life?
