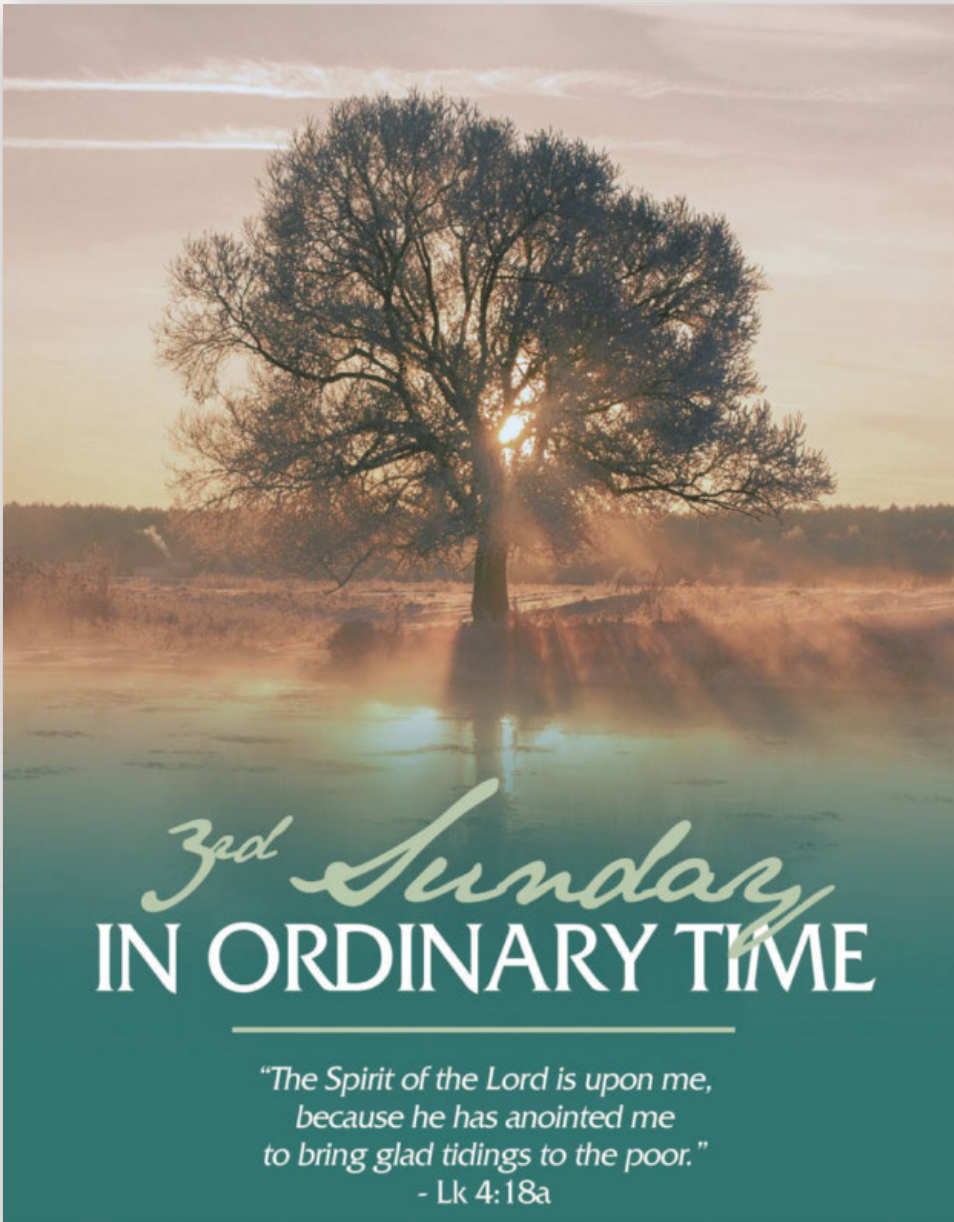

For those who attend infrequently or seldomly, I want you to understand that you are just as important. I wish for your sake there were more hours in a day for me reach you and attend to your spiritual and physical needs.

There are so many in our parish family who struggle with health issues. This sometimes leads to spiritual concerns. Some feel that God doesn't care for them, or even worse, that God has abandoned them. This is not true, but I also understand their feelings and wonder many times if I can help them at all.

The point I am hoping to make is that *each and every one of you* is important to me! I strive every day to serve you with my entire heart. For the times I have failed you, I ask for God's forgiveness and for your understanding. Please reach out to me if you feel I can help!

DAY 1 – Developing Baby -- “I’m here!”

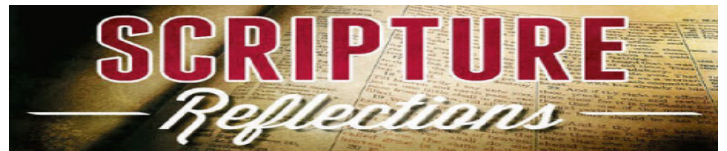

The Gifts We Have

The first reading is fulfilling a directive given by God to Moses to celebrate the “first day of the seventh month”. The book Nehemiah was reading from may have been Leviticus. The key statement for me in this reading is “allot portions to those who had nothing prepared”. A reminder that we need to look beyond ourselves. We are called to share what we have with those who are in need.

In the second reading we are reminded that we are all one body in Christ. We each are different, but, we all have gifts that were given to us by God and we are called to be one family, sharing those gifts in support of each another. Over time, I must have asked this question 100 times, “What are your gifts?” All too often those that I posed this question to failed to see the gifts they have. They are too often driven to compare the gifts they see in others to themselves and feel that their gift is not good enough to share. We all have one very powerful gift that we can share, the gift of prayer. It costs nothing and we have an endless supply to give away as well as an endless need from all of us to have someone pray for us.

In the Gospel today, Jesus is letting the people from his home town know that He is the gift to them. Jesus is the gift that was promised to them in the Old Testament. The people were blinded by their image of Him. He was just the son of the carpenter, Joseph. Do we see Jesus in others or does the image we have of someone blind us to recognizing that they are a part of one family in Christ?
