Updates from Around the Village

Zoning Code Recodification

Since 2017, the Village has been working diligently on the updating of its Zoning Code. The "finalized draft" has been placed on the front page of the Village's website for public consumption. The Village has conducted over 50 public meetings where this text as been discussed and for good reason! The last time the Zoning Code was updated in this fashion was in the early 1980's. The hope with regard to this recodification is to make the Village's Zoning Code more "user friendly" and easy to navigate. It will also have a website component to it for increased citizen interaction. On April 7th, the Plan Commission will be next considering this draft.

Intergovernmental Agreement with Germantown

The Village has been working in concert with the Village of Germantown for over the last year, for an agreement to provide sewer and water service to the Village's Northeast Corridor. This area is generally located north of STH 167, east of properties directly along STH 175, south of Pleasant Hill Road, and west of I-41. This area, consistent with the Village's Comprehensive Plan going back to 2004, is slated for "Office/Light Industrial" development. A proposed draft agreement will be sent to the Village of Germantown during the month of March and it is expected a decision will be reached by the end of the month. The cost for any of this type of infrastructure would be proposed to be paid for by a private sector development through the use of Tax Incremental Financing as a "pay as you go" type arrangement.

Highway Improvement Program

During the month of March, Staff will be conducting a public bid opening for our Highway Improvement Program and making a recommendation to the Village Board for their consideration at their regular meeting. For 2022, the Village has budgeted \$1.5M for road construction and road improvements. The arterial roads we currently have out for bidding are Bark Lake Road, Plat Road from CTH Q to Monches Road, and Hubertus Road from STH 164 to Hillside Road.

Richfield Historical Society—25th Anniversary

On January 30, 1997, the Richfield Historical Society was formed. Through their work and advocacy, during their 25 years of existence, they have helped create programing and events which have increased the quality of life in Richfield and they've helped sew the fabric of what makes Richfield such a special place. Our Historical Park is the crown jewel of our park system due to the Society's immeasurable hours of volunteer work and programing. We look forward to the next 25 years of the Society!



To license your pet you must complete a pet licensing application and provide a "Vaccination Certificate" from your veterinarian when you come to Village Hall. Pets who have been spayed or neutered cost \$10.00 per pet, per license and pets who are not spayed or neutered cost \$20.00 per pet, per

MS4/Stormwater

As we inch closer to springtime in Richfield, we will start to see snow melting as well as some spring showers. This stormwater runoff flows off building rooftops, driveways, lawns, streets, parking lots, construction sites, and industrial storage yards into storm sewers which then discharge into nearby waterways, like lakes or rivers, or treatment devices. Most stormwater does not go to a wastewater treatment plant for treatment before it is discharged into a river or lake, so it is important for us to be mindful of the pollutants such as garbage, lawn pesticides, pet waste, leaves, and grass clippings in the streets that can get swept into the storm sewer. These pollutants could harm



fish and wildlife populations, kill native vegetation, foul drinking water supplies, and make recreational areas unsafe and unpleasant. To learn more about the storm water runoff or the Village's MS4 permit program, visit www.dnr.wi.gov.

The Richfield Volunteer Fire Company needs more staff, especially volunteers, to continue fulfilling our mission. Our call volume has doubled over the last 20 years, while our membership has significantly decreased. We need your support to increase our staff. The most important way you can help is to volunteer. We pay for all training and pay hourly while on a call.

Members are trained through local technical colleges where they learn State certified skills, ultimately resulting in State of Wisconsin certification for Fire or EMS classes. There are many options available to specialize in with further training or more certification classes, such as vehicle extrication, rescue and recovery dive, hazardous materials, fire inspections, or one of many other specialties.

We are also looking for other skills where joining as an associate member may be the right fit for you. These are community members who have a passion to help others, but may not have the ability to serve in an active fire or EMS role. Examples may include skills such as advertising, recruitment, accounting, business management, vehicle maintenance, etc.


