

The Holy Family of Jesus, Mary & Joseph

The Feast of the Holy Family, usually celebrated on the Sunday following Christmas, marks a time to honor these three flesh-and-blood figures of faith and promise. It is also an occasion to consider the holiness inherent in domestic life. Jesus was born into a family who nurtured, protected, taught, and raised him to adulthood. Although we know little about his life as a youth, it is not hard to picture him doing the same things any well-loved child would do – playing games, learning to read, helping with household chores, moving into larger social circles among his relatives, neighbors, and townspeople. Through it all, Mary and Joseph are there to model what it means to live by faith and to illustrate what makes a family holy.

Reflection from Michael Federman, Director of Christian Formation

Friends, today we arrive at the Feast of the Most Holy Family of Jesus, Mary & Joseph. The Holy Family serves as the paradigmatic expression of the domestic church. For today's reflection I thought it would be good to think on this most critical institution that sets the tone for society and is a sure barometer of the health of the church; the domestic church or said another way, Catholic families.

"The family is, so to speak, the domestic church. In it parents should, by their word and example, be the first preachers of the faith to their children; they should encourage them in the vocation which is proper to each of them, fostering with special care vocation to a sacred state." -Lumen Gentium (Vatican II)

What are some ways you can foster the domestic church in your home? Here are some practical ideas:

- Instill a daily habit of prayer as a family. Start with meals and prayers before bed and eventually try family decades of the rosary and scriptural readings.
- Be sure to have crosses and crucifixes in the prominent locations of your home. Bedrooms, dining room, the kitchen, etc. Additionally, hang beautiful Catholic art in your home.
- Make sure to go to Mass in-person and as a family. Never miss without a grave reason.
- Speak openly and often about religious matters. Encourage your children's questions and give them a thoughtful answer. According to multiple studies, the number one reason young people leave the church is because they are never given an answer to their questions. Let's reverse this trend.
- Make sure your children see your witness to faith. A child seeing their parent in deep prayer, reading the Bible, and finding other ways to live the faith is powerful!
