

#### A Reflection from Deacon Matthew Ferch

Recently, I had the opportunity to go on retreat to prepare myself for my priesthood ordination which is rapidly approaching. It was led by Bishop Donald Hying of Madison. There, we reflected on what it means to be a priest in today's society. I had the opportunity to reflect on the Bishop's words, spend time in prayer with God, as well as read the life of St. John Vianney—the patron saint of priests. Over the next few weeks, I want to share with you all some of the takeaways that I came out of my retreat with. These takeaways are good for priests, but they are good for every Catholic to ponder and put into action in their own lives.

The first takeaway is the importance of a retreat. For those who do not know what a retreat is in the Christian sense, it is taking time away from the busy world and our busy lives to spend a period of time alone with Godespecially in prayer. Retreat can be a silent one, an active one, one with a series of talks, or one that is guided by a spiritual director. It is a wonderful moment to take time and recognize where God has been in your life and to ponder what God's will is for each one of us. I understand that for many it is not possible to make a full-fledged retreat like I made. Life and commitments get in the way. I encourage you all to instead try to take a few moments of your day to disconnect from the world a little bit and spend that time with God. Try to take some moments of your day and be in prayer in order to keep up that relationship with God. You would be surprised what the fruits of that would be!

#### St. Thomas Aquinas | January 28

One of the most famous members of the Dominican Order, St. Thomas Aquinas (1225 – 1274) is well-known by many for his theological work, "The Summa Theologiae." Born in Italy, his mother wanted him to become a Benedictine and had high hopes that he would eventually become abbot of Monte Cassino, where he spent much of his youth. To change his vocation, she had him kidnapped by his brothers on his way to Paris at the age of 19. He spent two years in their captivity. Despite this, nothing could shake him from his vocation to become a Dominican priest and he was eventually released. Once free, he went to Paris and then to Cologne, where he finished his studies with Albert the Great. His greatest contribution to the Catholic Church is his writings. The unity, harmony, and continuity of faith and reason, of revealed and natural human knowledge, encompasses his writings. The Summa Theologiae, his last and, unfortunately, uncompleted work, deals with the whole of Catholic theology.

The patron saint of teachers, theologians and students, St. Thomas Aquinas died in 1274. His life and the impact he had on the whole Church, however, remains alive today.
