Continuing Our Parish COVID Protocols

As we continue to learn to live with COVID-19 in our midst, and adjust to the changing variants, I am thankful for our pastors and parish leaders and their diligence in continuing the protocols already in place to help people feel safe while attending Mass. The protocols include clearly designated areas for mask wearing and social distancing (gathering area), as well as providing hand sanitizer and extra cleaning.

«Jesús cambia el agua en vino» (Juan 2:1-11)

¡JESÚS ES INVITADO A UNA BODA!

Hoy nos encontramos con el milagro de las Bodas de Caná. Un contexto festivo, una fiesta que celebra el amor de una pareja. María, “se da cuenta” de un problema que está afectando este importante momento. Eso es empatía:

darse cuenta de los problemas de los demás, estar en el zapato o en la piel del otro. Aquí es María, la Madre de Jesús, la que tiene ‘empatía’. Y le dice a Jesús: **“No tienen vino”**. Como diciéndole: **“Haz algo”**. Parece que la única solución era un milagro. María no pedía la conversión de los pecadores, ni pan para los hambrientos; solamente quería sacar de apuro al novio con un milagro; todo indica la fe grande en Jesús, y la generosidad y abundancia de la Gracia de Dios se manifestaron.

Ha comenzado la vida pública de Jesús. Un Dios que camina junto a su pueblo, aunque éste le dé de lado. Dios se hace presencia en una boda; a través de su hijo Jesús. Nos habla de un banquete, porque el banquete es el signo que nos anuncia la llegada del Reino de Dios.

En éste concretamente aparece su madre, a la que llama mujer recordándonos el relato de la creación cuando Dios presenta esta a Adán.

Su madre se dirige a Él para que llene las tinajas que se han quedado vacías de vino, Él sabe que no ha llegado su hora, también María, pero Jesús la obedece. Para el pueblo judío la mujer prácticamente no existía, su misión era la procreación. Sin embargo Jesús le da importancia, la realza.

María dice a los sirvientes que hagan lo que Él les diga, su confianza es absoluta, sabe que las tinajas vacías son el signo de una fe vacía de contenido que nos alejan de Dios.

Cuando Jesús llena las tinajas de vino, lo que nos está queriendo decir Juan el evangelista es que las tinajas las llena de alegría, de gozo, de amor compartido, de esperanza, porque Dios se manifiesta en este caso en el amor de dos personas que van a compartir su vida.

- María aparece en el evangelio en momentos muy concretos, aquí es la persona que confía plenamente en Él y nos está invitando a todos a dejarnos llevar por Él.
- *El texto nos recuerda que el matrimonio no es un formalismo, sino gozo y plenitud porque Dios se hace presencia entre dos personas que deciden amarse y caminar juntos.*

- *Jesús quiere entrar en nuestra vida con su poder para transformar nuestra miseria en el vino del crecimiento y de la realización. Y nos enseña a darnos también con generosidad.*

Para reflexionar:

En nuestra vida: ¿Qué vino nos hace falta, qué es lo que estamos necesitando? ¿Qué lección sacamos de la actitud y los silencios de María?

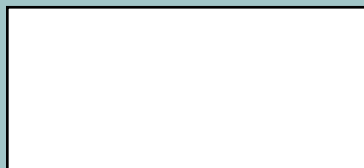

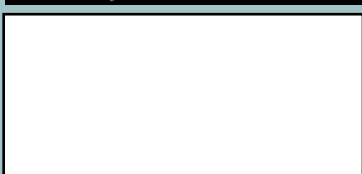

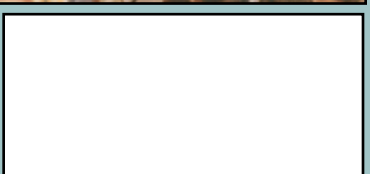
