PASTOR NOTE

Emergency Baptism: Every now and then, I am asked about when and how a person can administer emergency baptism. Normally, baptism ought to be done by a priest or deacon within the normal rituals of the Church. In an emergency situation, many of the usual rituals are dispensed. An emergency situation is when death appears near. It is not whenever receiving baptism is merely difficult, or whenever parents delay baptism of children, or whenever the person does not desire baptism. Here is the process of administering emergency baptism:

- 1. The person administering baptism can be any person, even a non-baptized person. The person administering baptism must have the intention to do what the Church intends. The person does not need to believe what the Church teaches but must simply intend to baptize the person as the Church baptizes.
- 2. Assess if the recipient is in danger of death. This can be a general judgment and does not need to be medically or professionally confirmed.
- 3. If possible, assess if the person has been baptized. Ask the recipient if he or she wants to be baptized. If the person is not able to respond, baptism ought to be administered. The Church presumes the person wants baptism and has not yet received it. Only if the person clearly denies baptism, should it not be administered. Instead, offer to pray with the person.
- 4. The administrator should make a purposeful intention to perform baptism according to the Church. This may simply be an internal thought or spoken word: I want to do as the Church does.
- Pure and clean water must be used. The water cannot be mixed with other liquids. The water does not need to be blessed holy water. Even a small amount of water may be used.
- 6. The administrator, and only the administrator, while pouring the water, says:
 - "(Name), I baptize you, in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit."

The water may be poured three times as each name is invoked; or, once; or, continually. The person is baptized!

Each situation is different and must be approached appropriately. The emergency ritual is quite simple: only one person performs the baptism, who has the intention of the Church, uses clean water, and says the proper words.

I hope that you are never in a situation where you need to administer baptism in the danger of death. But, it is helpful to know. Maybe someday God may use you as an instrument to bring a person to salvation. God Bless.

The greatest gift God gives to us is the gift of sanctifying grace. This gift transforms us from being a sinner into a saint. Sanctifying grace makes us holy, makes us an adopted child of God, makes us temples of God and it gives us the opportunity of heaven. This gift of grace is totally unmerited and no one deserves to receive it. Start to finish, it is God's free gift won for us through the blood of Christ. Once we have received sanctifying grace, it abides in us. It energizes our soul empowering us to grow in the ways of holiness and union with God. Sadly, we can loose sanctifying grace through choosing to sin again. But, by His love, we can once again receive sanctifying grace and grow in holiness.



In our daily prayer, we should thank and praise God for the gift of sanctifying grace. Obviously, it is an incredibly important part of our spiritual life

and it is the clearest sign of God's love for us.





January 16, 2022 2nd Sunday in Ordinary Time

God delights in you. How do you feel when you hear that? Delight usually comes with an exuberant flow of joy that seemingly arises from one's toes with the expression of great glee. Reflecting upon the deep measure of joy God has in us can be a source of joy for ourselves. Delight is infectious. A very young brother and sister were playing on the beach when the all too familiar ice cream truck made its daily rounds. The boy shook with excitement and delight as he took his sister's hand and exclaimed, "The ice cream man is here, isn't it great!" As they ran off toward the truck, one could hear the girl reply, "Yeah, I can't wait!" The experience of a child's delight in something so simple as ice cream, lifts our spirits from our burdens and transports us to the lighter, more innocent side of life.

Life is not meant to be a burden. Believe it or not, God actually wants us to be happy! In fact, the wedding feast at Cana shows us that God even puts His blessing on our happiness. 


