PASTOR NOTE

Adult Funeral Servers. One of the most important works of charity within the parish is providing a dignified funeral for our loved ones. Most funerals occur on weekday mornings. It is almost impossible for our young altar servers to help at funeral Masses. For the last few funerals I have not had any servers. As a result, a few minor liturgical functions have not been provided. I would like to remedy this and provide for a more dignified funeral.

I have decided to establish a team of Adult Funeral Servers. I invite adults to make a commitment to receive training, be available to serve funerals, and help provide a more dignified funeral Mass. This may be ideal for retired adults or adults who could offer about two hours of service on the day of a funeral. Adult Funeral Servers are open to both men and women, of any age. The requirements are somewhat simple: be able to perform the duties that are well known for serving Mass. These include carrying things, holding the Missal book, tolerating incense, and being comfortable in front of people. The adult servers would simply wear dignified lay clothes and not any special liturgical robes.

Each funeral will require three adult servers. Hopefully, the entire team of Adult Funeral Servers will be about 12 or 15 volunteers. This will allow a rotation of volunteers that will not become too burdensome.

There will be an Adult Funeral Server training session on Friday, February 4th, 10am, in the Church. This session will last about one hour. Those interested may simply come to the training session. If one is interested to serve but cannot attend the training session, other arrangements can be made for training. At the end of the training session, I will ask the volunteers to make a commitment for serving funeral Masses.

I hope that some adults will consider offering their time and talent to serve at funerals. It is truly a corporal work of mercy and adds to the dignity of funerals. Thank you for considering to become a member of the team of Adult Funeral Servers. Please contact me if you have any questions.

NOURISHED IN SPIRIT BY MSGR. KRUSE

I draw your attention to another kind of God's gift: actual grace. Actual grace is a free gift from God that opens our mind and strengthens our will to do good and to avoid evil. Actual grace is a temporary gift from God which helps us in a particular situation to know and choose what is good for us or avoid what is bad for us.

See what love God has for us. He chooses to give us sanctifying grace which changes our soul opening it for union with God. He intends this gift to be always present and active in our life. But, God is well aware of the presence of evil and its constant temptation. He knows our weakness and limitation. So, He also gives us actual grace: specific gifts to help us in specific moments. Through actual grace we are inspired to do what is good and right. See His love: sanctifying grace opens our heart to be in right relationship with God, and actual grace helps perfect our relationship.

God dispenses actual grace as He chooses and when He chooses. The story of the conversion of St. Paul is a wonderful example of actual grace. Remember the story. Saul was going to Damascus to arrest and persecute the early Christians. Jesus miraculously revealed His risen glory to Saul and asked, "Why are you persecuting me?" This is an extraordinary example of actual grace. Jesus chose to show Saul is divine glory. Saul questioned Jesus, "Who are you?" Jesus gave a further gift of grace by clearly identifying Himself, "I am Jesus, whom you are persecuting." Notice how Saul immediately accepted the gift and became one of the greatest friends of Jesus.

This story of Paul's conversion not only shows us actual grace in motion; but also, it shows us how our human powers are present and active. Actual grace engages all of our human powers: our senses, our mind, our will, etc. Through actual grace, God engages our human freedom. God never forces us. His gifts inspire and enlighten. Once the gift is given, we can either co-operate or reject His gift. Saul co-operated. But, remember King Herod. The Magi told him about the Messiah. This was an actual grace. Herod refused to believe, and in fact, tried to kill baby Jesus. God freely gives actual grace as He freely chooses, when He freely chooses and in the manner He freely chooses; but, we can freely accept or freely reject. We can freely dispose ourselves to receive God's actual grace. As Jesus established His kingdom through His Church, He also set up all kinds of ways to receive actual grace. He has guaranteed that actual grace is present in the life and activity of His Church.




A prayer for conversions

GOSPEL MEDITATION - ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

Human history reveals many periods where people lost a sense of God's transcendence. It may even be argued that human beings have been wandering and lost more than they have been at home and focused. Human nature being what it is, we struggle with who God really is — the God of our salvation history or the "gods" of human constructs. Relying on our own designs and pursuits, we forget that we really are meant to listen to One upon whom the Spirit of the Lord rests, Jesus Christ, and not to ourselves. That same history that reveals our fickleness and infidelity also reveals God's constancy and faithfulness. God always finds us.

As people wander and fumble to find their way, God is there bringing them back to holiness and giving them the assurance of His presence. We have to allow God's Word, God's life, to touch us and change us. It can make us more flexible and attentive to the sacred in all facets of life so that every day is one that is holy. Every day is a time when fulfillment is possible for one's soul. Jesus stood before those gathered in the synagogue as the fulfillment of words of promise that were echoed long ago. God doesn't forget. He always comes for us.

Now it is time to remember to go to God. Sometimes our lives are so confused and tangled that it is difficult to see the Word and hand of God. But when we realize, deep within, the depth of friendship God offers to us it really has the power to turn sadness to joy. The promise is fulfilled. Going frequently to God's Word, allowing ourselves to be enriched and rejuvenated, and pondering the certainly of God's fidelity and promise permanently transforms us. 
