#### **PASTOR NOTE**

I hope that you all enjoyed a wonderful Easter celebration. The Church celebrates Easter for eight straight days. This celebration culminates today, Divine Mercy Sunday. We contemplate the mercy of God as given to us through Christ's death and resurrection. For a few years, our parish has held a special parish event on this day. I encourage you to join us beginning at 2:30pm in the church. We will have Eucharistic Adoration and recite the Divine Mercy Chaplet. After our brief adoration, food will be provided from Los Ranchitos. Then, there will be many activities for the youth and social time for the adults. There will also be door prizes which you do not want to miss. I encourage everyone to come join us for this special event.

Recently, the family of the late Barbara Heuer donated a beautiful statue of St. Margaret Mary Alacoque. Barbara and her husband Buster acquired this statue from the parish of St. Margaret Mary in Wyanet. They were long time members of that parish and when it closed years ago they joined St. Louis parish. This statue adorned the old Wyanet church for quite a long time. #### NOURISHED IN SPIRIT BY MSGR. KRUSE

People of that day counted any part of a day as a full day. So, Jesus was buried on Friday (day one), silently entombed on the Sabbath, Saturday, (day two), and then early in the morning on Sunday, the first day of the Jewish week, Sunday, (day three):

And behold, there was a great earthquake; for an angel of the Lord descended from heaven, approached, rolled back the stone, and sat upon it. His appearance was like lightening and his clothing was white as snow. The guards became shaken with fear of him and became like dead men. Then the angel said to the women in reply, "Do not be afraid! I know that you are seeking Jesus the crucified. He is not here, for he has been raised just as he said. Come and see the place where he lay. Then go quickly and tell his disciples." (Matt 28:2-10)

Three days after Jesus was crucified and buried, he truly rose from the dead. Each Gospel includes accounts of Jesus' resurrection. Each tell us that the tomb was empty. Each show us that Jesus was truly alive and demonstrating the signs of life: walking, eating, and talking. The disciples touched him. He touched them. For forty days after the resurrection, Jesus clearly shows that he was alive – not a ghost and not a fantasy. He was really, truly, absolutely alive! The same Jesus that they knew in his public ministry, the same Jesus they saw crucified, the same Jesus who they buried in the tomb, was the same Jesus did not resurrect into a new body. It was the same body that he always had.

But, he was also different. The fear-filled apostles huddled in the upper room behind a locked door. Yet, Jesus walked through the door. Jesus would appear in the presence of his friends, but they did not easily recognize him. He could mysteriously appear and disappear. And, he had wounds that did not hurt him. Remember that Jesus stood before Thomas totally alive, but he had a painless, gaping, mortal wound in his side, his hands, and his feet. Thomas placed his fingers into the side of Christ. He could feel the warmth of Jesus' flesh and the beat of his heart. But, despite these wounds, Jesus was alive. Christ's real resurrected body was different – it was glorified. It enjoyed new powers and new ways of existing. Ways the Church does not fully understand.

Through the gospels and her teachings, the Church has constantly maintained two fundament truths about Christ's resurrection. It was a real, true, actual, bodily resurrection and that this body was glorified. Throughout history, these aspects have been attacked, denied, overemphasized, under emphasized, and regularly misunderstood.

#### St Bede Scholarship opportunity for Students

The Knights of Columbus announces a \$500 Scholarship opportunity per student attending St Bede Academy this fall. However, the amount of an individual scholarship could be lower depending on the number of applicants as there is a limitation on the total amount of scholarships. The annual limitation will be determined by the Council. Scholarships are limited to practicing Catholics who are members of St Louis Parish. Scholarships will only be considered for the student's first year of attendance at St Bede. There is an upper income limitation. Students from families with adjusted gross income, as shown on the most recent federal income tax return for the current year, of \$150,000 or more are not eligible. Scholarship funds will be provided directly to St Bede Academy. Scholarship application forms can be found on the table outside Harkrader Hall and must be returned before July 1, 2022.




