NOURISHED IN SPIRIT BY MSGR. KRUSE

I have a very selective memory. I can remember the silliest things, but I forget some very important things. Sometimes this can be very funny. Other times it can be embarrassing. I am sure that you all can relate to moments of lapsed memory. In this newsletter I want to take a moment and reflect upon human memory.

Take a moment and contemplate your faculty to remember. Our memory is a very amazing and mysterious power. Our memory is hugely important. It is the glue that binds together our day to day and moment to moment life. Obviously, memory links us to our past, but it is also a propellant towards the future. Reflecting on the past give insights for future choices. Memory is an important factor in human intelligence and knowledge. Imagine your life without the powers of memory. Sadly, this is not hard to imagine if you have any experience with people suffering from dementia or Alzheimer's disease. Our life is terribly impeded when we loose our power of memory. Our memory is an important component of our humanity. And, it is an important part of our spiritual life. Memory is of great importance in one's spirituality.

Throughout the Old Testament, the nation of Israel is constantly called to remember the mighty works of God. There is a regular mention of the patriarch's Abraham, Isaac and Jacob. Later, Moses and David are regularly mentioned. These holy men are called upon not simply as hero's from the past, but as a way to remind the people of God's wonderful works. Their very names inspired memories of God's promises, power and glory. Above all else, the Passover event was the greatest moment in Jewish history. God definitely acted and choose his holy people as he led them out of the slavery of Egypt. God commanded that the Passover was always to be remembered through it's ritualized meal. This memory and participating in its ritual was the very binding force within the Jewish community.

In a similar way, we celebrate the annual rituals of Holy Week where we recall the saving events of Christ's death and resurrection. These events bind us in mutual faith. At the last supper, Jesus commanded his apostles and the entire Church to "do this in remembrance of me." Again, God demands that his mighty deeds be remembered through a ritual of a worshipfilled meal. These events become a moment to remember again the works of God from long ago and share in them.
