# Adult Education / RCIA

We are *THE* Bible Church! While, certainly, most of us Catholics could stand to bone up on our knowledge of Sacred Scripture, so much of what we already do in our prayer is intensely Biblical. ## United We Stand!



# All Saints and All Souls Day

November 1st and 2nd are very important days for us as Catholics. On the First we recognize the Communion of Saints that we profess in the Creed—the "vast cloud of witnesses" (Heb. 12) that dwells now in perfection before the Lord. This includes the Saints we know so well: St. Joseph, St. Mary, St. Patrick, St. Anthony, St. Therese... But it also includes all those many Saints that lived quiet and hidden lives. We honor them as well and ask for their prayers.

This wonderful tradition began in September 1934 when Fr. Thomas Dade of the Archdiocese of Baltimore celebrated the first Mass. In these trying times, let's especially offer our support for those who risk their lives and safety for us. This year's Mass is at St. Mary's Church in Peru (1319 Sixth St) on October 7th at 6:30pm.



## On The Cover

The famous and familiar painting of Our Lady of Pompeii is a miraculous image found in the Pontifical Shrine of the Blessed Virgin of the Rosary in Pompei, Italy. It depicts Jesus and Mary presenting Rosaries to St. Dominic and St. Catherine of Siena. The image has a fascinating story.

Bartolo Longo was born in 1841 to a relatively wealthy family. His stepfather was a lawyer and he enrolled in the University of Naples to also study law. University culture at the time was very anti-Catholic. The nationalists, who were organizing the Italian unification, saw the church and the Holy Father as a threat to their plans.

The young Bartolo fell victim to this worldly culture, which also had a strong presence of the occult ceremonies and spiritualist seances. Eventually he was even ordained a Satanic priest. Finding his new life depressing and suffering from nervous disorders, anxiety, and suicidal thoughts, he was encouraged by an old friend to talk to a Dominican priest.

The priest introduced Bartolo to the Holy Rosary, which brought him much joy. He rediscovered the goodness of Christ and his Church. He even became a third order lay Dominican, taking for himself the religious name of "Rosario." With zeal for the faith, he then moved to the poor area of Pompei to teach the faith and promote devotion to the Holy Rosary.

While in Pompei, Bartolo began the project of restoring a church in honor of Our Lady. When considering art for the renewed church, the Dominican priest who first introduced him to the Rosary sent him an image. The painting was purchased by the priest in a junk shop. It

was of poor quality, damaged, worm-eaten, and arrived in Pompei upon a shipment of manure!

Yet, the people received the image with great love. Miraculous healings began to happen among the people as the prayer and devotion grew. The image was eventually restored several times with St. Catherine being added in place of St. Rose.

Bartolo Longo, once a disillusioned student and Satanist priest, became the builder of a Pontifical Shrine, the founder of a religious order of sisters (the Sisters of the Holy Rosary of Pompeii), and the patron of houses for the poor, orphans, and the children of the imprisoned. In 1979, St. John Paul II beatified Bartolo Longo. May he pray for us!
