At the Name of Jesus!

Dear Friends,

This month we continue to celebrate Christmas. We also celebrate the Solemnity of Mary Mother of God, the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord, and, of course, Catholic Schools week! The month, though, is traditionally dedicated to the Holy Name. In the Old Testament the name of God was so holy that it was never spoken aloud. We, in the New Testament, are given a little more familiarity with the name of God's son, *Yeshu or Jesus*, meaning *GOD* is salvation. The name, as we know, was announced to Mary in Nazareth, but it would have officially been given to Jesus in the new year, at his circumcision.

We see then, that the Holy Name takes the unutterable name of God and turns it into a prayer for salvation. When we say the Name, we make evil flee, we bring hope into our hearts, and we entrust our trials to Heaven. A beautiful way to keep the Lord's name always near at hand is through the Jesus Prayer. The prayer is usually said: **"Lord Jesus, Son of God, have mercy on me, a sinner."** Its form is roughly taken from the many pleas we hear made to Jesus in the Gospel. This short prayer can always be on our lips, ready to fly to heaven. This is why saints, like St. Augustine, called it an "arrow prayer." The prayer can also be used as an approved Act of Contrition in the Sacrament of Confession.

During this first month of the year, let's renew our commitment to use, and use well the Sacred Name. This, of course, means avoiding any misuse of the Name. We don't need to tolerate entertainment or conversations that use this Name in a sacrilegious way. When we hear the Name abused, let's make a prayer of reparation, maybe saying the Jesus Prayer, or saying "Blessed be the Name of the Lord." It is a beautiful Catholic custom to slightly bow the head when we speak the name of Jesus.


Remembering Fr. Spilman, 1947-2021

Father Spilman had been out of school for 25 years when he began his studies for the priesthood. He called it an eye opening experience. "But you have a lot of good times, too," he said, recalling with a laugh that the other seminarians called him "Grandpa." His age and a career in banking gave him an important perspective on what was important, however. "You can fill your plate up with so many things," Father Spilman said. "But you're responsible for people — you want them to get to heaven."

Born in Galesburg, Father Spilman attended Costa Catholic High School and then served for four years in the U.S. Air Force. After being honorably discharged in 1970, Father Spilman earned an associate degree from Carl Sandburg Junior College in Galesburg in 1972. He worked in banking in Galesburg, East Peoria and Peoria, until 1991. Along the way he started to think that things in this life weren't that important.

"It's things in the next life that are more important," he told The Catholic Post. "You can put your hopes in things of this earth, but we know we aren't going to be here forever. I think that got me a little bit." Accepted as a seminarian for the Diocese of Peoria, Father Spilman was sent to Holy Apostles Seminary in Cromwell, Connecticut and completed his studies for the priesthood at Mount St. Mary's Seminary in Emmitsburg, Maryland.

His first assignment was to Holy Cross in Champaign, and would go on to be pastor at St. Joseph in Colfax and St. Rose in Strawn; St. Theresa in Earlville; St. Anthony in Spring Valley and St. Mary in Peru; and then St. Anthony, Immaculate Conception and Sts. Peter and Paul, all in Spring Valley, and St. Gertrude in Seatonville.



When the Spring Valley parishes reconfigured in 2013 as part of the Growing in Faith Together process and became The Nativity of Our Lord Parish, he stayed on for five more years and was granted senior status in 2018. In retirement, Father Spilman lived in Granville and assisted the priests in the Illinois Valley area.

Epiphany of the Lord

Epiphany marks the making known of the Christ Child to the Magi from the East. When they entered, they brought with them blessings and prophecy. We wish the same for our family homes as well. In an ancient custom that harkens to the marking of the door lintels with the blood of the Passover lamb, Catholics can also mark their doors for Christ in the new year with chalk. This is traditionally done on Epiphany, which this year in the United States is January 2nd, but it is universally always the 12th day after Christmas on January 6th. There are many different prayers that can be offered for the "chalking of the doors" and many can be found online. A simple one is provided to the right.

After the prayer, the home can be sprinkled with holy water. Then, above the door, is written the millennium and century, the letters CMB, and then the year. **(This year: 20+C+M+B+22)** CMB stands for Christus Mansionem Benedicat, or Christ Bless this House. They are also the initials of the three kings: Caspar, Malchior, and Balthazar. Blessed chalk is available at the Holy Family side altar.

May all who come to our home this year rejoice to find Christ living among us; and may we seek and serve, in everyone we meet, that same Jesus who is your incarnate Word, now and forever. Amen.

God of heaven and earth, you revealed your only-begotten One to every nation by the guidance of a star. Bless this house and all who inhabit it. Fill us with the light of Christ, that our concern for others may reflect your love. We ask this through Christ our Savior. Amen.





Extra Day of Christmas Vacation

Please pray for the repose of the soul of Fr. Bob Spilman, former pastor of the Parish of the Nativity of Our Lord. Father died on Christmas morning. May the Newborn King welcome him into His Kingdom! Fr. Spilman was first assigned to our area when he came to Earlville in 2001 and then to Spring Valley in 2004. In 2013, after the reorganization of the Spring Valley Parishes, he became the founding pastor of Nativity of Our Lord. Father was given senior status by Bishop Jenky in 2018, but remained in Granville assisting at parishes in the area.
