THE HOLY WEEK begins with the celebration of Palm Sunday. On Palm Sunday, we celebrate Jesus' triumphant entry in the city of Jerusalem, riding on a colt, with people singing and acclaiming Him as "King and son of David."

<u>On Holy Thursday</u> - we remember Jesus instituting the two great Sacraments: Sacrament of the Eucharist and of Holy Orders. You cannot have the Eucharist without the priesthood, and you cannot have the priesthood without the Eucharist. These two Sacraments go together both for the nourishment, and for sanctification of


the people of God. All of the four Gospels show that Jesus instituted these Sacraments ONLY in the presence of His apostles, all of whom were men. This is one of the great basis today of reserving Holy Orders for men. Usually on this day, there would be the washing of the feet, but because of the COVID-19 regulations, there will be no washing of feet this year.

<u>Good Friday</u> - This is the ONLY day in the entire year when there is no Mass celebrated in the whole world. On this day, we commemorate the "Passion and death of Our Lord." Where possible, people may also celebrate the Way of the Cross. Catholics on this day observe both fasting and abstinence.

Easter Vigil - In the evening of Holy Saturday, we celebrate the resurrection of the Lord. This is a celebration of joy and triumph over sin and death. It is a celebration of an Alleluia! This year, during the Easter vigil celebration, we shall have two catechumens baptized and confirmed. One of them will also celebrate her marriage (this will not make the Mass any longer than any other Easter vigil celebrations we are used to. We thank God that we have this couple getting married during that Mass).

Easter Day - The Day of the Lord's resurrection. The Day of the Lord. The Day of triumph. We join the angels and saints in singing "Alleluia." Christ died, Christ is risen, and He lives forever, 'no more to die.'

NOTE: Divine Mercy Sunday - Eight days later (after the resurrection from the dead), we shall celebrate the Divine Mercy Sunday.

Fasting consists of eating only one meal, with the possibility of two smaller snacks that do not add up to a single full meal.

Catholics age 14 and older are to abstain from meat on all Fridays in Lent.
