

Feast of St. Blaise and World Day of Prayer for the Sick

Fiesta de San Blas y Dia Mundial de Oración por el enfermo

Feast of St. Blaise, Bishop and Martyr

This past Thursday, February 3rd, we celebrated the feast of St. Blaise. We will commemorate St. Blaise's Feast day at the conclusion of our weekend Masses this weekend with a communal blessing of throats and omit the touching of the blessed candles to people's throats due to the pandemic. This is a change from the recent past where we were able to have individual blessing of throats by priests using blessed candles.

St. Blaise was a physician who later in life was ordained to the priesthood and eventually was made Bishop of Sebaste in Armenia. When the persecution of Christians began, he took refuge in the hills. He was discovered living in a cave by men who had been sent to hunt him down under an order of the governor. While in prison awaiting trial and torture, Blaise performed a miraculous cure of a young boy who was choking to death on a fish bone. In gratitude, the boy's mother brought Blaise candles and food while he was imprisoned. It is because of the miraculous healing of the little boy that devotions to St. Blaise for healing of throat ailments grew through the centuries and is still performed today.



Fiesta de San Blas, Obispo y Mártir

Este pasado jueves, febrero 3, celebramos la fiesta de San Blas. Nosotros vamos a conmemorar la fiesta de San Blas al final de cada misa este fin de semana con una bendición comunal de gargantas y omitiremos tocar las velas bendecidas en las gargantas de las personas debido a la pandemia. Esto es un cambio del pasado cuando el sacerdote podía bendecir individualmente las gargantas de las personas con la vela bendecida.

San Blas fue un medico que tarde en su vida fue ordenado sacerdote y eventualmente fue el Obispo de Sebaste en Armenia. Cuando la persecución de cristianos comenzó, él se refugio en las colinas. El fue descubierto viviendo en cuevas por los hombres que fueron enviados a perseguirlo y encontrarlo bajo las ordenes del gobernador. En prisión bajo tortura mientras esperaba su juicio, Blas hizo un milagro cuando curó a un niño que se estaba muriendo asfixiado con un hueso de pescado. En gratitud, la madre del niño le trajo a San Blas velas y comida durante su tiempo en prisión. Es por este milagro de sanación del niño que la devoción a San Blas por sanación de gargantas creció por siglos y todavía se hace.

World Day of Prayer for the Sick 2022

Friday, February 11

St. Pope John Paul II instituted this annual day thirty years ago in 1992 for believers to offer prayers for those suffering from illnesses. The Pope himself was diagnosed with Parkinson's a year before in 1991. The day coincides with the commemoration of Our Lady of Lourdes. Interestingly, Pope Benedict XVI also declared his decision to resign from his post as the Pope on this day in 2013, citing his failing health as the reason behind his decision.

Pope Francis concludes his 2022 message for this year's day of prayer with these words: "To the intercession of Mary, Health of the Infirm, I entrust all the sick and their families. United with Christ, who bears the pain of the world, may they find meaning, consolation and trust. I pray for healthcare workers everywhere, that, rich in mercy, they may offer patients, together with suitable care, their fraternal closeness."

Let us pray with our Holy Father for all the sick. Especially, we pray for an end to the health pandemic and all of those who care for the sick during this difficult time.

Dia Mundial de Oración por el enfermo 2022 Viernes Febrero 11

Papa Juan Pablo II instituyó este día hace 33 años en 1992 para los creyentes ofrecer sus oraciones por todos aquellos que sufren de enfermedades. El papa mismo fue diagnosticado con Parkinson un año antes, en 1991. Este día coincide con la conmemoración del día de Nuestra Señora de Lourdes. Interesantemente, Papa Benedicto XVI también declaró su decisión de renunciar a su posición como Papa en este día en el 2013, siendo su mala salud la razón para esta decisión.

Papa Francisco concluye este día de Oración con estas palabras: Queridos hermanos y hermanas, encomiendo todos los enfermos y sus familias a la intercesión de María, Salud de los enfermos. Que unidos a Cristo, que lleva sobre sí el dolor del mundo, puedan encontrar sentido, consuelo y confianza. Rezo por todos los agentes sanitarios para que, llenos de misericordia, ofrezcan a los pacientes, además de los cuidados adecuados, su cercanía fraterna.

Oremos con nuestro Santo Padre por todos los enfermos, especialmente oremos por el final de la pandemia y por todos los que cuidan a los enfermos en estos tiempos difíciles.

Gospel Reflection/Reflexión del Evangelio

Gone Fishin'

In today's Gospel, we've gone fishin'. Ok, it's really not about fishin', it's about mission (and bad rhymes, apparently). Today's Gospel and our first reading are about God calling people to mission. In fact, the two stories are quite similar in structure. A person witnesses a miraculous sight: Isaiah has his temple vision and Peter and the other disciples experience the huge catch of fish. Both Isaiah and Peter profess their unworthiness to be where they are because of their sinfulness. God addresses their sinfulness (the burning ember; "be not afraid") but still calls on them to be his messengers on earth. But these are not the only sinful people God calls to mission – we, too, are called to mission. Every week we witness a miraculous sight – bread and wine becoming the body and blood of Christ. And though we know we are sinners, God extends his mercy and forgiveness, but also calls us to evangelize at the end of each Mass. In fact, our word Mass comes from the word missa from the old last line of the Mass – "Ite, missa est – "Go forth, she (the collective Church) is sent." Missa is related to the word missio, from which we get our word mission. So, after Mass this Sunday, let us ask ourselves, "On what mission am I being sent?" Then, upon answering that, it's time to go fishin'!



Fuimos de Pesca

En el Evangelio de hoy, hemos ido de pesca. Ok, no realmente a pescar, es acerca de la misión (y rimas malas aparentemente). El Evangelio de hoy y nuestra primera lectura hablan sobre como Dios llama a las personas a una misión. En efecto, las dos historias tienen estructuras similares.

Una persona es testigo de una visión milagrosa: Isaías tiene su visión en el templo, mientras que Pedro junto a los otros discípulos experimentan la captura de una enorme cantidad de peces. Isaías y Pedro, profesaron su falta de mérito para estar donde estaban por ser pecadores. Dios aborda su estado de pecadores (la brasa ardiente; "no tengas miedo") pero de todas maneras los llama para ser sus mensajeros en la Tierra. Pero estos no son los únicos pecadores que Dios llama a una misión – nosotros también estamos llamados a una misión. Cada semana nosotros somos testigos de una visión milagrosa – pan y vino se convierten en el Cuerpo y la Sangre de Cristo. Y aunque sabemos que somos pecadores, Dios nos extiende su misericordia y su perdón, pero también nos llama a evangelizar al final de cada Misa. En efecto, la palabra Misa viene de la palabra missa sacado de la ultima línea de la Misa antigua – "Ite, missa est"–"Vayan, ella (la Iglesia colectiva) es enviada. Missa esta relacionada a la palabra missio, de donde obtenemos la palabra misión. Despues de la Misa este domingo, preguntémonos, a que misión he sido enviado? Y después de contestar esta pregunta, es tiempo de ir a pescar!

We Have Many “Openings” for Mass to be Offered for Your Intentions

When we offer a Mass for a deceased loved one, we are asking God to apply the graces of the Mass to that person’s soul, so that their time of purification (purgatory) can be brought quickly to completion and they can enter into the fullness of heaven. This is a truly loving and faith-filled thing to do.

The Catechism points this out: “From the beginning the Church has honored the memory of the dead and offered prayers in suffrage for them, above all the Eucharistic sacrifice, so that, thus purified, they may attain the beatific vision of God.” (CCC 1032). But our faith is imperfect, our love is imperfect, so it is possible that although our prayers and offering do indeed benefit the person who has passed away, they may not be sufficient to bring that person’s purification period to an end. And so, we continue to exercise both our faith and our love by having more Masses offered.

This is a beautiful expression of the communion of all believers in Christ – a communion that transcends time and space. If the person you offer the Mass for is already in heaven (if their stage of purification has been completed), then God will surely not let the offering go to waste – God will honor your love and faith and allow it to benefit another member of the Body of Christ. These offerings are not arithmetic; they are animated by faith and love, and as long as our faith and love (and hope) are alive and well, our offerings are a legitimate and fruitful expression and exercise of them, something that gives glory to God and that benefits the whole Church.

Es una expresión hermosa de la comunión de todos los creyentes en Cristo – una comunión que trasciende tiempo y espacio. Si la persona por la cual la Misa es ofrecida está ya en el cielo (si su tiempo de purificación ha sido completado) Dios se asegurará que los ofrecimientos y las gracias de esa Misa no sean desperdiciados – Dios honrará tu amor y fe, y permitirá que otro miembro del Cuerpo de Cristo se beneficie. St. Josephine Bakhita

St. Josephine Bakhita—Feb. 8

St. Josephine Bakhita was born into a wealthy Sudanese family near Darfur in 1869. She was kidnapped when she was nine years old and forced into slavery. Her kidnappers named her Bakhita ("fortunate" in Arabic). She was sold and resold, beaten and tortured by her "owners" until 1883 when she was purchased by an Italian consul who treated her well. He brought her to Italy to work as a nanny. In 1889, the Italian courts ruled that Bakhita was enslaved illegally and declared her a free woman. She became enamored with the Catholic faith, chose to stay in Italy, baptized in 1890, and received her First Holy Communion from the future Pope St. Pius X. She took the Christian name of Josephine, and in 1896 entered the Institute of Canossian Daughters of Charity. She was affectionately called "Our Black Mother" by the Italians. She was known for her charity towards children and the poor, her indomitable spirit during the hardship of slavery, and her joy in religious life. St. Josephine Bakhita is the patron of Sudan, and her feast day, February 8th, has been designated the International Day of Prayer and Awareness Against Human Trafficking.

Dia Internacional de Oración y Conciencia en Contra de Tráfico Humano

Febrero 8 ha sido designado como el día anual de oración y conciencia en contra del tráfico humano por el Consejo Pontificio por Justicia y Paz y la Unión Internacional de Generales Superiores. 

St. Josephine Bakhita—Feb. 8

Santa Josephine Bakhita nació cerca a Darfur en 1869 en una familia sudanés de mucho dinero. Ella fue secuestrada a los 9 años y fue forzada a ser esclava. Sus secuestradores la llamaron Bakhita ("afortunada" en árabe). Fue vendida muchas veces, fue maltratada y torturada por sus "dueños" hasta 1883 cuando fue comprada por un cónsul italiano quien la trató bien. El la llevó a vivir a Italia a trabajar como niñera. En 1889 las cortes italianas declararon que Bakhita había sido esclava ilegalmente y la declararon como mujer libre. Bakhita se enamoró de la fe católica y escogió quedarse en Italia, fue bautizada en 1890 y recibió la primera comunión por el futuro Papa San Pius X. Ella tomó el nombre cristiano de Josephine y en 1896 entró al Instituto Canosiano De las Hijas de La Caridad. Ella fue llamada afectuosamente "Nuestra madre negra" por los italianos. Ella fue reconocida por sus trabajos de caridad hacia los niños y los pobres, su indomitable espíritu durante dificultades de la esclavitud, y su alegría en la vida religiosa. Santa Josephine Bakhita es la patrona de Sudan, y el día de su fiesta, febrero 8, ha sido designado como el Dia Internacional de Oración y Conciencia en Contra de Tráfico Humano.

Spending Time with the Gospel of Luke






Praying with the Sunday Gospels


