

This weekend we are pledging our support to the Annual Catholic Appeal. I encourage all 1,555 households to participate to the level they are able. It would be great to increase the total number of households from last year and to do our best to support the many ministries in our

diocese. The theme this year is: "Open the way for the Gospel." We have been given the goal of \$120,400 to contribute as a parish. Please consider making a larger gift to pay monthly. Your support in the past and continued support now are greatly appreciated.

Synodal Church: Communion, Participation, and Mission General Session Registration

Pope Francis called for and is leading the next synod for the universal Church. As a diocese, our Go Make Disciples Initiative, V Encuentro, Rural Life Listening Sessions, and recently our Disciple Maker Index Survey are just a few of the ways the Holy Spirit has inspired the diocese to listen to the people of God throughout our eleven counties. We also had a Synod listening session with the Presbyteral Council and a listening session with the Pastoral Council this fall. This **Sunday, February 27**, there will be a Synod General Listening Session for the Diocese:

I am planning on attending this event. It will start with Mass at 1:00 pm with Bishop Hying. After Mass there will be facilitated small group discussions. The listening session will address:

- 1) Where and how is the gospel being lived and preached effectively in the Diocese of Madison? What can be done to foster and promote that?
- 2) Where and how is the gospel not being lived and preached effectively in the Diocese of Madison? What can be done to improve that?

The conversations will be synthesized and forwarded to the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops, which in turn will forward their synthesis to Rome. Sacrifice

What is the definition of sacrifice? If you ask people, most might say something akin to "give something up." But the word sacrifice comes from two Latin words which literally mean "to make sacred, or holy." Too often we concentrate on the negative process — "What are you giving up for Lent?" — instead of the positive result "I am making myself holier through my Lenten actions." Sacrifice is not primarily the act of giving something up; it is the act of growing holier. And growth leads us to . . . Ashes.



Growing up on the farm in Missouri, Deacon Jerome remembers making extensive use of the fireplace in the winter, creating lots of ashes. They then spread those ashes on the gardens and fields. Used correctly, ashes are an excellent fertilizer, resulting in the growth of a fruitful crop. On Ash Wednesday, we will be marked

with ashes. How will those ashes help us grow in holiness during Lent? In the Catechism Jesus' call to conversion and penance, like that of the prophets before him, does not aim first at outward works, "sackcloth and ashes," fasting and mortification, but at the conversion of the heart, interior conversion. Without this, such penances remain sterile and false. However, interior conversion urges expression in visible signs, gestures and works of penance. (CCC1430)



are growing in holiness together, so let us pray for each other!



NOURISHED BY GIVING. WITHOUT sacrifice, THERE IS NO love. Here are some other ideas for becoming holier this Lent through a sacrifice of time:

- ◊ Pray a daily offering before even getting out of bed (see reverse)
- ♦ Clean up after someone who usually serves you.
- Avoid placing demands on the time of others, that might hinder them from observing the Lord's Day.
- Extend an invitation to someone to come to Mass with you. Come early in order to prepare your hearts by spending a few moments in quiet prayer.




Haz los Domingos Especiales

¿Cuál es la definición de sacrificio? Si le preguntas a la gente, la mayoría podría decir algo parecido a "renunciar a algo". Pero la palabra sacrificio proviene de dos palabras latinas que literalmente significan "hacer sagrado o santo". Con demasiada frecuencia nos concentramos en el proceso negativo: "¿A qué estás renunciando por la Cuaresma?" — en lugar del resultado positivo "Me hago más santo a través de mis acciones cuaresmales". El sacrificio no es principalmente el acto de renunciar a algo; es el acto de crecer en santidad. Y el crecimiento nos lleva a . . . Cenizas



Cenizas

Al crecer en la granja en Missouri, el diácono Jerome recuerda hacer un uso extensivo de la chimenea en el invierno, creando muchas cenizas. Luego esparcían esas cenizas en los jardines y campos. Usadas correctamente, las cenizas son un excelente fertilizante, lo que da como resultado el crecimiento de una cosecha fructífera. El Miércoles de Ceniza, seremos marcados con cenizas. ¿Cómo nos ayudarán esas cenizas a crecer en santidad durante la Cuaresma? En el Catecismo, la llamada de Jesús a la conversión y a la penitencia, como la de los profetas antes que él, no apunta primero a las obras exteriores, "cilicio y ceniza", ayuno y mortificación, sino a la vocación del corazón, a la conversión interior. Sin esto, tales penitencias quedan estériles y falsas. Sin embargo, la conversión interior apremia la expresión en signos visibles, gestos y obras de penitencia. (CCC1430)




Spending Time with the Gospel of Luke




Praying with the Sunday Gospels



Contemplative Dialogue: My Life with the Saints

The focus of contemplative dialogue is on listening rather than formulating a response to what another is saying. Simply hearing another's point of view and reflecting on it can inform and enlighten our own perspective in a way that debating or analyzing it cannot. We are challenged to listen more carefully and approach different points of view by looking at the deeper values and issues underlying them. Gospel Reflection

Adult Confirmation

Lk 6:39-45

Lent will be here in just a few days, and our readings today come at an opportune time to help us prepare for that season. Our Gospel gives us a good 3-step process to get us started. First Jesus remarks about the blind leading the blind, and thus the importance of the disciple

learning from the teacher. How much of Jesus' teaching have we absorbed, understood and made part of our lives? Once we have grounded ourselves in Christ, it is time for reflection – what parts of my life must I change before I can truly live a Christian life? What is the plank in my eye? And finally, after immersing ourselves in Christ and attending to "the plank in our eye," how can we bear fruit through our words and actions in the world? In the upcoming season of Lent, we are offered an unparalleled opportunity to work on these three steps through prayer, fasting and almsgiving. These are all forms of "sacrifice" – that is, ways to make ourselves and our world more holy.

A Place at the Table: African Americans on the Path to Sainthood

There are no African-American Saints formally recognized within the Catholic Church, but that could soon change. There are six incredible Black men and women who are on the path to Canonization. The Catholic Church is starting to formally recognize their impact and may soon name any or all of them saints. It's time to hear their stories. *Formed.org* has a newly released documentary on the lives of these six people.

Venerable Pierre Toussaint. Born enslaved, Toussaint gained success as a hairdresser and used his resources to serve the poor.

Servant of God Mother Mary Lange. Lange was the founder of the Oblate Sisters of Providence and the first African-American superior of any religious order.

Venerable Henriette Delille. Legally unable to join a religious order because of her African heritage, Delille started the Sisters of the Holy Family, an order that still ministers to people today.

Venerable Fr. Augustus Tolton. Tolton escaped slavery and traveled to Rome to become ordained. He was the first African-American priest in the United States.

Servant of God Sr. Thea Bowman. Bowman converted to Catholicism as a child, became a nun, and spent her life singing, teaching, and preaching to promote devotion to Christ.

The lives of these holy people are wonderfully narrated by people who thoroughly know their lives and their cause for sainthood. The documentary can be viewed using your free subscription to *www.formed.org* As with all saints, we can learn how to live holier lives as we learn of theirs.

Rosebud Program

Prayer is part of our Catholic faith, and everyone is in need of prayers throughout their lives. The Rosebud Program is a way for parents and grandparents to request prayers and support for anyone who is pregnant, celebrating birth or adoption, grieving miscarriage, stillbirth, abortion, infant or child death or waiting to become pregnant or adopt.

Here is how it works: at the back of church there are a variety of colored roses and cards that address the needs listed above. Each rose represents a special need. The person wanting prayers writes their name on the card matching their prayer request and the appropriate colored rose and then puts it into the vase. The prayers are put onto the prayer chain.


