

Second Sunday of Lent

As we continue our Lenten Journey, we are given the Gospel of the Transfiguration to reflect upon. Last Sunday we heard how Jesus was triumphant over the temptations of the devil. Even when we are tempted, Jesus is there with us and for us to help us. He knows what it is like to be tempted

and he can help us to overcome the temptations we face. On this Second Sunday of Lent, we see how the Transfiguration of Jesus reveals to us the ultimate goal of our faith journey which is the Resurrection, but we get there by carrying our cross. So we go up the mountain with Jesus this Lent by our commitment to daily prayer in the 1% Challenge (spending 15 minutes per day in prayer). Through heartfelt prayer, we gaze on Jesus' glory and allow his light to shine on our life. This time in prayer reminds us of our final goal of the Resurrection and eternal life. In this way we are able to better face the crosses that we carry with renewed hope and a new attitude that our sacrifices now will bring great reward in the end.


Thank You

Stations of the Cross

Consider attending Stations of the Cross during Lent on Tuesday evenings at 6:00 p.m. This sacred tradition dates back to the early days of the Crusades when pilgrims would walk the road of Calvary to Golgatha in Jerusalem. The stations are an invitation to place ourselves within that journey, reminding us of Christ's perfect example and the depth of His love. There are many versions of prayers that go along with the stations. Each Tuesday evening, a different version is used to offer us a variety of reflections on the passion and suffering of Jesus and the deep meaning it has for our lives as disciples. There are times in life when we are grateful that someone is helping us carry our crosses, and there are other times when we have the opportunity to help people bear the burdens of their cross in life. In this way, the stations become more than just about something in history, but it becomes something that is alive in our faith today. If you have never experienced this prayer or if it has been a long time, I invite you to experience the Stations of the Cross during Lent.

Carbon Fast for Lent
Our Care for Creation Team
offers a couple resources that
you may glean from as you
prepare for your Lenten
journey. The "Carbon Fast

for Lent" calendar prepared by the UK School Sisters of Notre Dame in 2021 provides daily opportunities to act on our commitment of caring for God's gift of creation.

3/13-Remove one light bulb in your home or tape over the light switch and live without its light for the whole period of your carbon fast (please make sure it's in a safe place to do so!) It will act as a reminder of how reliant you are on electricity.

3/14-Be aware of how much water you use to clean dishes, and when you cook only use the minimum amount of water. When you wash vegetables, save the water in a bucket and re-use – maybe you can flush the toilet with it!

3/15-Allow yourself to wonder at the abundant, diverse and beautiful creatures in the world, even in your garden if you have one. Create a habitat to encourage insects. Simple bug box ideas abound on the internet, https://supersimple.com/article/bug-hotel/.

3/16-The need to reduce plastics, especially single-use plastics, is urgent. Check your cupboards and note how many groceries are wrapped in plastic. Consider using a refill shop instead.

3/17-Try making some of your own cleaning products! Look up how to make them using ingredients like lemon and vinegar. It's better for the environment, your wallet and your health.

3/18-Start a meat-free Friday pledge. Christians have been eating less meat during Lent for generations. Choosing meat-free meals could be the single most effective way to reduce your carbon footprint.



Lk 9:28b-36

We have been talking about "sacrifice" quite a bit this Lent, and in today's readings, we have references to God's acts of sacrifice, if you will, ways in which he works to make us holy. In our first reading, we hear the story of God cutting a covenant with Abram. I use the word cutting intentionally, heavy that is have account.

covenant with Abram. I use the word cutting intentionally, because that is how covenants were sealed in ancient times – sacrificial animals were cut in two and the participants in the covenant would walk between the halves. The significance was that the participants were saying in effect, "If I break the covenant, let what happened to these animals happen to me." In our Genesis story, it is only God, in the form of the smoking pot and burning torch, who passes between the animals. God was showing Abram just how serious he was about making him the father of a holy nation, by essentially taking the whole risk of breaking the covenant upon himself.

In our Gospel story of the transfiguration, we hear an oblique reference in the discussion of Jesus, Moses and Elijah about what Jesus "was going to accomplish in Jerusalem." What they are talking about is his passion, death and resurrection. Again, God seals a new covenant with the blood of a sacrificial victim. He takes onto himself all of our sins, making of us a new, holy people. We are indeed, as it says in 1 Peter 2:9, a holy nation, and we are to live as holy people – that is, as people who 'sacrifice' – people who make themselves and the world, a holy place. So this Lent, think about how we are sacrificing to be God's holy people.

There will no longer be ministers sanitizing hands in the balcony. However, sanitizer will continue to be available at the entrance and around the church.


Safe Seating in the Social Hall

Disciple Maker Index



The Results are in!

Several months ago, St. Thomas Aquinas and all the parishes in the Diocese participated in a parish-wide survey, the Disciple Maker Index. If you remember, the survey asked questions around parishioner's own discipleship journey and how the parish as well as the pastor was doing in supporting them along their faith journey.

More than 500 parishioners completed the survey – an outstanding 60% response rate of our average 840 Sunday Mass attendees!

A small sampling of parish responses is provided below. More detailed analysis of the complete survey results will be released from time-to-time as we continue to unpack the data and discern its implications.

A Disciple Maker Index Snapshot – Three of the Top Strengths for Our Parish:

92% agreed or strongly agreed that they would recommend Fr. Bart to a friend

93% agreed or strongly agreed that they would recommend our parish to a friend

84% agreed or strongly agreed that the Eucharist really is the body and blood of Jesus Christ

Thank you to all who took the time to participate in the Disciple Maker Index survey. It is an important piece of the puzzle to help us in sharing the Good News of Jesus Christ and forming Missionary Disciples.

We are still unpacking all of the information we received from the survey but are excited and energized by how it can impact the life of the parish. We look forward to sharing more about what we've learned and how we're using this information to help inform our decisions as we move forward as a parish where people experience Jesus in a way that changes how they live!

Into His Likeness: Be Transformed as a Disciple of Christ


Dr. Edward Sri's *Into His Likeness* provides a Lenten companion to those who, while recognizing their weaknesses, wounds, and sins, know the truth of their higher calling: to be perfected in God's love and transformed in Christ.

Sri describes the ancient disciple-rabbi relationship in which the disciple would follow the rabbi so closely that the dust kicked up from his rabbi's feet would cover him. Today, we are called to follow our Rabbi, Jesus Christ, so closely that we are covered with his life, changed, and made new.

Into His Likeness is well suited to small group study, with participant and leader guides to accompany the six 30-minute videos on *formed.org*.
