

Gospel Reflection

Adult Confirmation

Lk 13:1-9

"If you do not repent, you will all perish." Jesus uses this line twice in our Gospel today, speaking, not only to the crowd around him, but also to us. There are a couple of things to note in this short sentence. First, the word 'repent.' We sometimes use the words



'repent' and 'regret' somewhat interchangeably, but they are not quite the same in nuance. Regret is to feel sad, sorrowful or disappointed about something that has happened or has been done. The word 'repent' has those same feelings, but also adds the element of change. When we repent of our sins, it is not enough to be sorry – that would just be regret - we must also make that inward conversion toward God and make a change in the way we conduct our lives to try to sin no more. Second, is the word 'perish.' Notice Jesus does not say that God will punish us; he says we will perish. The word 'perish,' at its etymological root, means 'to be lost.' If we do not repent of our sins, we have wandered from God and are lost. Repentance is turning from our sins and finding God again. True repentance is a form of sacrifice, a way of making ourselves more holy. And the very end of our Gospel today gives us hope. In Jesus' parable of the fig tree, the fig is not producing fruit, and yet the gardener argues for patience to give the tree time to bear fruit. God is patient with us as we struggle with sin and strive for repentance. So this Lent, let us cultivate the soil of our soils, so that they will bear fruit as we repent and turn to God.



Easter in Art

An 11th-century mosaic in Basilica di San Marco in Venice depicts Holy Saturday, when Jesus "descended into hell," according to the Apostles' Creed, to bring the faithful dead to eternal life.

In *The Resurrection* by Piero della Francesca, Jesus emerges triumphantly from the tomb that resembles an altar, rising above the sleeping guards. The 15th-century work resides in the Museo Civico in Sansepolero in Tuscany.

Mary Magdalene reaches for the risen Jesus in Giotto di Bondone's *Resurrection* (*Noli me tangere*), as Jesus instructs her: "Do not hold me." This 14th-century work rests in the Cappela Scrovegni (Arena Chapel) in Padua.
