

The disciples ask Jesus to teach them how to pray and he teaches them the "Our Father." Jesus Christ invites His disciples to experience prayer, placing them directly in communication with the Father, inspiring in them a longing for a personal relationship with God, with the Father.

You could make the argument that the *Our Father Prayer* is one of the most precious gifts Jesus has left to us during his earthly ministry. Jesus shows us how to enter into a direct dialogue with God, who is our Father and we are His children! This prayer taught to us by Jesus is the synthesis of every prayer, and it is a true gift to know this prayer and to pray it. Especially when we pray it during the Communion Rite during Mass, the prayer brings us together as God's children and gives us the perfect words to be in intimate communion with God. Let us pray it and mean each word we pray.


Natural Family Planning (NFP) Awareness Week: Called to the Joy of Love

The Catholic Church teaches that marriage is an original gift from God to humanity. Although sin entered the world damaging the marital relationship, this gift was not lost but redeemed by Christ and raised to a sacrament (see Eph 5: 28-32; see also Mt 19: 4-6). Sacred Scripture proclaims that God created humanity in "His image" as "male and female" (see Gn 1: 27). So unique is this relationship that the marital union makes of husband and wife "one flesh" (Gn 2: 24). Procreation, Scripture teaches, is a gift from God (Gn 1: 28). When spouses conceive new life, they participate in the Lord God's creative power. This is an awesome privilege and sacred responsibility!

The Catholic Church teaches that the best way of living out this sacred responsibility is by practicing NFP. NFP is a method of understanding a couple's fertility in their decision to avoid or achieve pregnancy and is up to 99% effective and 100% natural, and extends the mutual care of the woman's fertility into the faithful and life-giving love of husband and wife in all aspects of their marriage.

As pastor, I want to promote the Church teachings on Marriage and Family and also support and encourage our families who are practicing NFP. There is a lot of information on this topic and here is a link to learn more about NFP: NFP Resources | USCCB

Aunque el pecado entró en el mundo dañando la relación conyugal, este don no se perdió sino que Cristo lo redimió y lo elevó a sacramento (cf. Ef 5, 28-32; cf. también Mt 19, 4-6). La Sagrada Escritura proclama que Dios creó a la humanidad a "su imagen" como "varón y mujer" (cf. Gn 1, 27). Tan singular es esta relación que la unión marital hace del marido y de la mujer "una sola carne" (Gn 2, 24). La procreación, enseña la Escritura, es un don de Dios (Gn 1, 28). Cuando los cónyuges conciben la vida nueva, participan del poder creador del Señor Dios. ¡Este es un privilegio asombroso y una responsabilidad sagrada!

La Iglesia Católica enseña que la mejor manera de vivir esta sagrada responsabilidad es practicando la PNF. La PFN es un método para comprender la fertilidad de una pareja en su decisión de evitar o lograr un embarazo y es hasta un 99% efectivo y 100% natural, y extiende el cuidado mutuo de la fertilidad de la mujer al amor fiel y vivificante de esposo y esposa en todos los aspectos de su matrimonio.

Gospel Reflection

Luke 11:1-13

Wow, there are so many themes in this week's readings that it would require pages of reflection to cover them all. Instead, I will focus on just one subject that is close to my heart: the aorta. Wait, no, while that **IS** close to my

heart, that's not what I want to talk about – or, rather it is, in a roundabout way. I want to talk about humor and spirituality. There are elements of humor in both first readings and the Gospel. Although both readings deal with "serious" subjects, there is some humor in the way Abraham deals with God. And Jesus uses some absurdist-type humor when speaking of giving a child a snake or a scorpion when asked for food. Both make use of humor to highlight God's mercy. In our lives, we often divorce humor from our spiritual life, feeling perhaps that it is too serious a matter for humor. But a judicious use of humor can enhance a spiritual life, and humor can be used to gently force us to consider deeper issues. Humor is a part of our daily life and should be part of our relationship with God. Many saints made use of humor, even in the most dire circumstances (St. Lawrence, "Turn me over, I'm done on that side") to demonstrate their faith and hope in the Lord. So this week, try to find some way to incorporate some humor in your spiritual life and have a heart-y life.

We've named our parish priorities...we've discerned our goals... now it's time to figure out the strategies to get us there!

About 9 months ago, all parishioners were invited to complete the *Disciple Maker Index Survey*, to reflect on their own spiritual growth and discipleship and identify the ways in which the parish supports that growth. Over 500 people shared their opinions.

Based on those results we were able to name the top priorities for our parish. This was accomplished with the help of members of the Evangelization Commission, Pastoral Council, and the 120+ parishioners who attended the May 11 Parish Renewal Town Hall. We named two priorities that would be the most impactful areas to focus on as we seek ways to best support everyone in their discipleship journey: nurturing a personal relationship with Jesus and developing greater engagement of young adults, including families with young children. Truly the Holy Spirit was guiding the conversation, as these two priorities were clearly where we as a parish were being called.

After naming the two priorities that we intend to focus on for the next 2-3 years, the parish needed to set SMART goals, and once again, we looked to parish members to help us discern two things we wanted to accomplish. In late May, almost 20 different parishioners, widely representing our parish demographic, helped to set the following goals:

Priority: Nurturing a Personal Relationship with Jesus

Goal 1: By April, 2024, St. Thomas Aquinas will increase participation in small groups by 10%.

Goal 2: According to the DMI, 20% of respondents have attended a retreat. By April, 2024, St. Thomas Aguinas will increase that percentage to 30%

Priority: Develop greater engagement of young adults, including families with young children

Goal 1: By April, 2024, St. Thomas Aquinas Parish will have a 100% increase in the number of families registered for faith formation/sacramental preparation (for children of catechetical age), from 145 to 290 households.

Goal 2: By April, 2024, St. Thomas Aquinas Parish will develop and involve 25% of newly married couples, parents of newly baptized children, newly initiated, or newly registered young adults in follow-up opportunities.

As you can see, we've accomplished so much, and we are thrilled at the level of investment and prayerful help that parishioners have had in this process. God has been guiding our parish through the collective wisdom of our parish family. But we're not done yet!

On Tuesday, August 2, 6:30-8pm, there will be one more opportunity to share your insights. We need to put concrete strategies into place to achieve our goals. <u>How</u> are we going to increase the number of those attending retreats? <u>What tools</u> are we going to use to reach out to families with children of catechetical age? <u>Which programs</u> will most effectively help us involve young adults at multiple stages in life?

We invite you to join us!

Bring your prayerful, creative thinking. Bring your openness to the Holy Spirit.


